Community Overview

History

Pikwitonei is located on the Hudson Bay Railway which reached the community in 1914 serving as a division point until 1972. Railway employment is now limited to track maintenance.

Access

The community is 304 kilometres (km) by rail northeast of The Pas and 48 km southeast of Thompson. The railway provides the only all-weather surface linkage. A logging road and winter road link the community to the all-weather road network for about six to eight weeks.

Governance

The community is represented by a mayor and council under The Northern Affairs Act.

Economic Overview

Pikwitonei is located within an area suitable for recreation as well as forestry development. Pockets of clay soils with some suitability for agriculture are also found in the area. Trapping is a vital economic activity. Commercial fishers harvest on six nearby lakes and deliver fish to the Wabowden fish station. Wild rice has been planted in some of the surrounding area.

Water is from the Pikwitonei River, filtered, chlorinated and distributed to a piped system.

Wastewater is piped by low-pressure wastewater lines to a lagoon located in the community.

Solid waste is picked up once a week and delivered to the community site. Businesses must arrange for their own waste transportation.


