Community Overview

History

Princess Harbour is positioned on a small peninsula on the east shore of Lake Winnipeg, 304 air kilometres (km) north of Winnipeg, 10 km west of the Bloodvein First Nation and 65 km by air south of Berens River.

Access

Ferry and air service was discontinued in 2015 and currently the community has no public mode of transit access. There is no all season road.

Governance

Recognized in 1972, it is represented by a contact person and defined as a settlement under The Northern Affairs Act.

Economic Overview

Fishing on Lake Winnipeg was the major source of employment. The Princess Harbour fish station handles the catch from local fishers and surrounding area. Tourism has become a large part of the economy with its natural beauty and the recent discovery of centuries old Petroforms (Sacred Spiritual Site of the First Peoples of Turtle Island). There are wildlife/nature tours, as well as sport fishing. Some trapping occurs in the Bloodvein Registered Trapline Zone.


