Community Overview

History

Two closely related, adjoining but independent areas are known as Red Sucker Lake. The reserve side is part of the Island Lake Band, which was granted reserve status in 1978. The other area is located on two nearby islands. Information relates to the non-reserve side, unless otherwise noted.

Access

Located on the north shore of Red Sucker Lake, 350 air kilometres (km) northeast of Winnipeg and 285 air km southeast of Thompson. There are no land linkages, except winter roads.

Economic Overview

Red Sucker Lake is situated in the Precambrian shield region of the province. There are indications of the presence of gold, lithium and nickel ore bodies in the area. Presently, there are no operating mines. The area is heavily forested, but the remoteness and lack of transportation makes harvesting this resource impractical. The primary activity is trapping, with limited fishing. The area shares the Island Lake Registered Trapline Zone with Garden Hill, St. Theresa Point and Wasagamack.
