## A List of the Most Serious Crimes

If you are a victim of a serious crime, *The Victims' Bill of Rights* makes sure that you can ask for help and get information. Victims of the criminal acts listed below have the right to register to be given information and services.

- murder
- attempted murder
- manslaughter
- sexual assault causing bodily harm
- aggravated sexual assault
- sexual assault with a weapon
- sexual assault with more than one attacker
- sexual assault with threats to third party
- infanticide
- workplace fatalities
- criminal negligence causing death
- impaired operation of a vehicle causing death
- dangerous operation of a vehicle causing death
- aggravated assault
- assaulting a peace officer or public officer
- discharging a firearm with intent
- parent or guardian procuring sexual activity
- corrupting children
- computer luring of children
- living off the avails of a prostitute under 18
- procuring a prostitute under 18
- an offence under *The Highway Traffic Act* that relates to the death of a person
- criminal harassment
