



## **MEDICAL RADIATION TECHNOLOGISTS**

Medical Radiation Technologists play a vital role in the diagnosis and treatment of many injuries and illnesses by operating equipment that use radiation, x-rays and other forms of electromagnetic energy, to administer treatment and produce images of body structures. Hospitals, cancer treatment centres, clinics and radiological laboratories employ them.

### **EDUCATIONAL REQUIREMENTS**

Successful completion of a Medical Radiation Technology training program at a university, college or hospital education program is required.

### **WORK EXPERIENCE REQUIREMENTS**

Applicants must have a minimum of 1950 working hours (approximately equivalent to one year full-time) of clinical/work experience as a Medical Radiation Technologist (MRT) within the past five years.

### **CERTIFICATION / REGISTRATION PROCESS**

#### **Step One**

To be eligible for registration as an MRT in Manitoba an individual must first apply to the **Canadian Association of Medical Radiation Technologists (CAMRT)** for certification. The applicant must submit verification/documentation\* of:

- successful completion of a medical radiation technology training program, i.e., original or certified copies of transcript, certificate and/or diploma;
- clinical/work experience as an MRT within past 5 years;
- CPR Basic Rescuer Level C certification, or equivalent (cardio-pulmonary resuscitation for adult, child, and infant);
- official language proficiency in English or French (if not first language); i.e., Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) and Test of Spoken English (TSE) scores;
- the syllabus from the completed university, college or hospital education program;
- a completed application form (available from CAMRT and on the web site at [www.camrt.ca](http://www.camrt.ca)), and
- an examination fee (\$600.00 for 2007).

\* If documents are not in English or French, notarized translations are required.

The verification of clinical/work experience can be an official letter from an employer confirming a position of employment as an MRT. This confirmation must include the start and end dates of employment (clinical experience).

All applicants who have not graduated from a program or completed the minimum clinical/work experience requirements must successfully complete a *Medical Radiation Technology Training Program* and pass the required examination before they can work in Canada as an MRT.

When the above requirements have been met, the applicant must successfully complete the CAMRT *Certification Examination*. Examinations are scheduled for January, May and September, and can be written at any site listed on the application form. In Manitoba the test can be written in Winnipeg and Brandon. When this examination has been successfully completed the applicant is given a CAMRT certificate and a letter stating he/she is eligible to register with a provincial association.

## **Step Two**

Working in Manitoba

To become registered to work as an MRT in Manitoba, the applicant must provide the **Manitoba Association of Medical Radiation Technologists (MAMRT)** with the letter from CAMRT confirming his/her eligibility and pay the annual registration fee of \$275.00.
