



Librarian's Picks



Kings of the rings: 125 years of the world's biggest bonspiel / Sean Grassie. Winnipeg: Great Plains Publications, 2012. 208 p.

From **Great Plains Publications**:

Thousands of curlers can say they've played in the world's largest bonspiel in Winnipeg. For some, it's been a step on the road to Brier glory. For others, it's their one chance each year to battle a provincial, Canadian or even world champion. The tradition dates back to 1889,


when curlers first came (toting their own rocks) to the Manitoba Curling Association's annual bonspiel.

In Kings of the Rings, Sean Grassie chronicles the long history of the MCA bonspiel. The 2009 Canadian mixed champion offers unique insight into the grind, opportunity and prestige of playing in the world's largest bonspiel. The careers of many of its champions – such as Ken Watson, Don Duguid and Kerry Burtnyk – are covered in great detail. Find out how their successes in the bonspiel have spurred them on to curling's biggest prizes. Each year, hundreds of curlers enter the chase. Did you know that a Manitoba premier once won a trophy in the bonspiel, or that Winnipeg Blue Bomber legends Bud Grant, Gerry James and Don Jonas have all played in it? Kings of the Rings examines how curlers from all walks of life have been swept up by the MCA bonspiel craze.


Imagining Winnipeg: history through the photographs of L.B. Foote / Esyllt W. Jones. Winnipeg: University of Manitoba Press, c2012. xxv, 154 p.

In an expanding and socially fractious early twentieth-century Winnipeg, Lewis Benjamin Foote (1873–1957) rose to become the city's pre-eminent commercial photographer. Documenting everything from royal visits to deep poverty, from the building of the landmark Fort Garry Hotel to the riots of the 1919 General Strike,



Foote's photographs have come to be iconic representations of early Winnipeg life. In *Imagining Winnipeg*, historian Esyllt W. Jones takes us beyond the iconic to reveal the complex artist behind the lens and the conflicting ways in which his photographs have been used to give credence to diverse and sometimes irreconcilable views of Winnipeg's past. Incorporating 160 stunning photographs from the more than 2,000 images in the Archives of Manitoba Foote Collection, *Imagining Winnipeg* challenges our understanding of visual history and the city we thought we knew.

In 1903, Edward VII was King; Sir Wilfred Laurier was Prime Minister. Bison grazed on wild prairie in Silver Heights. Riders on horseback traveled alongside streetcars and buggies on Main Street.

Winnipeg: Images from a Century Ago is a faithful reproduction of a book originally published in 1903 that captures a rare glimpse into our city's early

splendour.

This remarkable book showcases 600 stunning photographs of Winnipeg's architecture, streetscapes, public spaces and city life around the turn of the 20th century. While many buildings and locations are now just memories, surprisingly many still exist today.

From NorthWords Writers Festival:

This anthology, published by Great Plains Publications of Winnipeg, under its Enfield and Wizenty imprint, with funding from De Beers Canada, is the first of its kind. It features stories by seventeen NWT writers that express the diversity of the territory. Included are stories of teenage angst in small communities; connection with the land; the Giant Mine strike of 1992; relationships both failed and renewed in Yellowknife; getting lost in the bush; Europeans shipwrecked and

saved by Inuit; Inuit taken on ...board by Europeans; learning from elders and other cultures; a wonky tourism outing; going to jail for breaking a dog bylaw and many more. The anthology also includes a foreword by well-known NWT Author Richard Van Camp.
