





# Librarian's Picks

One for the road: new plays for one actor / Kit Brennan, editor. Winnipeg: Signature Editions, 2012. 159 p.


#### From **Signature Editions**:

One for the Road is a collection of recent Canadian plays for one actor. Often written and produced for touring and festivals, plays for one performer offer unusual challenges and benefits for both sides of the theatrical event: actor, and audience. The plays in this volume come from writers across the country, and have been road-tested in a variety of venues, from main stage to fringe, and other stops along the way.



What is most exciting about a play for one actor? Often, it's the wonderfully intense storytelling that takes place, sometimes it's a bravura performance. [...] Sometimes a one-person play arises from a personal experience — a kind of living, breathing memoir — one that the artist shapes and hones to express an important discovery or a burning question. In all cases, solo plays draw their audiences deep inside a theatrical expression, an individual vision. Laugh, cry, get angry, be moved by the strong stories in this exciting collection.

The anthology will be of particular interest to students and teachers looking for current, challenging scene work for young actors, as well as to actors searching for the perfect solo piece. Included in the volume are interviews with the playwrights, in which they discuss the creative process of writing and of producing the work.



**Alec's journey** / written by J.C. Wesley. Winnipeg: Pemmican Publications, 2012. 136 p.

From CM: Canadian Review of Materials (Vol. XIX, No., 31, April 12, 2013): Career teacher Wesley's first novel traces the struggles of a young Inuit orphan as he adapts to life in the white man's world. Alec experiences a remarkable degree of kindness and assistance from most of the people he encounters, unlike many young Inuit who find the challenges overwhelming. The novel succeeds in depicting life in the north and paints the barren landscape with kindly brush strokes as it follows Alec's journey from the Barrens' community to the HBC trading posts and finally to the big cities of Winnipeg and Ottawa. Alec is an appealing protagonist, intelligent, thoughtful, and adaptable,

whose observations and commentaries at times tend to be somewhat mature for his age. The novel is not an easy read, and young readers of Alec's age group may find the vocabulary difficult. As well as enhance the flow and pace, Wesley's using more dialogue and activity, rather than descriptions of feelings and thoughts, might strengthen the story and allow the reader to draw conclusions about character traits and personalities by actions rather than by didactic prose. Alec's Journey could be useful in social studies and history classes, and fiction featuring an Inuit protagonist is a welcome addition to school and public library collections.


**The silent summer of Kyle McGinley** / Jan Andrews. Winnipeg: Great Plains Teen Fiction, 2013. 224 p.

#### From McNally Robinson:

When no one listens, what's the point of talking? Kyle McGinley doesn't say a word. Fed up with being shuttled from one foster care home to another, he has stopped speaking. But at the home of Scott and Jill Wardman, with the help of a crow, and a swamp, and an excess of blank paint, he begins to think that maybe, just maybe, life could be better. As long as his frigging dad doesn't mess things up.





Once houses could fly: kayaking north of 79 degrees / Rosemary Clewes; George Payerle, editor. Winnipeg: Signature Editions, c2012. 107 p.

#### From **Signature Editions**:

In Once Houses Could Fly, ten kayakers snail along the rugged fjords of Ellesmere Island in the High Arctic. Here under the roofless world, the ancient killing fields of the Thule people become campsites for tents, pitched among the bleached bones of sea mammals and the rough docks of shore-ice.

These poems speak of the bite and beauty of weather and the limits it sets on us. Be it "Jeremiah on a rampage" or the "which-way of ice," the polar desert has a habit of dismantling expectations. There is nowhere to hide, no turning

back. Beginner's prowess ends in taking inventory of thumbs and "aging's howl," yet the light's redemptive peace settles all distress, and what lasts is the quiet gratitude that overtakes the narrator, as the journey sets the pace for the soul to catch up with the body.

The book recalls this journey as a summoning to oneself: a humility, which does not anticipate competence, which opens its arms to the unfolding world.


