

Summary: honouring the truth, reconciling for the future is the first volume of the Final report of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of **Canada.** It is a summary report of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada's investigation of the residential school system and its legacy. This summary volume includes the history of residential schools, the legacy of that school system, and the full text of the Commission's 94 recommendations for action to address that legacy.



**Summary: honouring the truth, reconciling for the future** is available at both the Reading Room in the Legislative Building, and the Library's 200 Vaughan Street location in the Archives Building, as well as being available for legislative and government staff to borrow.




**Atlas of Indian nations** / Anton Treuer. 1st edition. Washington, DC: National Geographic Books, 2013. 319 pages.

#### From **Publishers Weekly Reviews**:

"The land made the first people of North America," insists Ojibwe scholar Treuer (Everything You Wanted to Know About Indians but Were Afraid to Ask), and in this gorgeously illustrated volume employs the atlas format to demonstrate this reality. Chock full of historical and contemporary maps, photographs, and paintings, this smart hybrid of art book and textbook is irresistible to leaf through because of the eye-catching images on every page. But Treuer's clear, accessible text is the complementary gem. The book is divided into eight



chapters based on geographical region, each concluding with a set of tribal histories. Forming the core of each chapter are gripping stories of events such as the Trail of Tears and the Battle of Little Bighorn, and brief biographies of notable figures such as the Nez Perce leader Chief Joseph. Not strictly a history book, Treuer's focus on the primacy of land also suggests the interconnection of past and present. In the Arctic and Subarctic, for instance, the impact of climate change on local ecology underscores the contemporary problems, and thus potentially massive cultural changes, faced by local indigenous peoples. This happened before on the Great Plains in the 1870s, when whites killed millions of buffalo. Land, nature, and culture, as Treuer shows, are always intertwined.

#### From the publisher:

Western Canada's natural environment faces intensifying threats from industrialization in agriculture and resource development, social and cultural complicity in these destructive practices, and most recently the negative effects of global climate change. The complex nature of the problems being addressed calls for productive interdisciplinary solutions. In this book, arts and humanities scholars and literary and visual artists tackle these pressing environmental issues in provocative and

transformative ways. Their commitment to environmental causes emerges through the fields of environmental history, environmental and ecocriticism, ecofeminism, ecoart, ecopoetry, and environmental journalism.

This indispensable and timely resource constitutes a sustained cross-pollinating conversation across the environmental humanities about forms of representation and activism that enable ecological knowledge and ethical action on behalf of Western Canadian environments, yet have global reach. Among the developments in the contributors' construction of environmental knowledge are a focus on the power of sentiment in linking people to the fate of nature, and the need to decolonize social and environmental relations and assumptions in the West.





#### From Choice Reviews:

This volume's central thesis is that the canoe is not a national symbol but rather is a powerful connection to the Canadian national vision in several formative domains [...] Erickson explores the future of the Canadian nation through the canoe as a discursive fetish that exposes the symbolic anchors of nature, narration, and nation. Derrida-like, the author explores the "ontopology of the canoe" that connects behavior and landscape involving the role of the canoe in wilderness, historiography, artistic representations, and the ontology of seeing the world. The first engagement is the canoe as mediator between Europeans and indigenous peoples. Successive chapters



address the canoe and the culture of leisure, the canoe and the politics of wilderness, and the role of recreational nationalism. A provocative conclusion challenges the heterosexual white masculinity embedded in the mythic canoe and speaks to a more complicated history of Canada and the canoe. Emphasizing that this is not intended to be a standard history of the canoe, Erickson problematizes its role in the continually evolving politics of Canadian nationalism.


Harold Kemp was born in 1892 in England and moved to Saskatchewan, Canada, as a boy to join his father--an Anglican clergyman who was working for the superintendent of Indian missions. At age sixteen, Kemp began working for the Hudson Bay Company and became enamored with the fur trade. Originally, Northern Trader was published in 1956. The 2014 edition includes photos that were taken by Kemp during his time in the fur trade. It is a historically important account, the only full-scale recollection written by a "French Company man." It is also a coming-of-age memoir of a boy who, through physical and emotional challenges, becomes a man

living in the wilderness with his family and influenced by the indigenous inhabitants of the land around him.

The unique historical, economic, and social features of the Canadian North pose special challenges for the social economy – a sector that includes nonprofits, cooperatives, social enterprises, and community economic development organizations. *Northern Communities Working Together* highlights the innovative ways in which Northerners are using the social economy to meet their economic, social, and cultural challenges while increasing local control and capabilities. The contributors focus on the special challenges of the North and their impact on the scope of the social economy, including analyses of land claim organizations, hunter support programs, and Indigenous conceptions of the social economy.



A welcome resource for scholars and policy-makers studying any aspect of the Canadian North, Northern Communities Working Together is a major contribution to the literature on the social economy in Canada.
