

From treaty peoples to treaty nation: a road map for all Canadians / Greg Poelzer and Ken S. Coates. Vancouver; Toronto: UBC Press, 2015. xxviii, 337 pages.

From Choice Reviews:

Canadians generally see the status and situation of First Nations in two ways: the well-being of Aboriginal peoples is a government responsibility because the government created the 1876 Indian Act, or it is the responsibility of First Nations alone to ensure their own well-being. Poelzer and Coates argue that both perspectives are wrong. It is the responsibility of all Canadians to deal with the challenges Aboriginal Canadians face—it is time for all Canadians to live as "treaty peoples." Despite largely negative attitudes that the majority of non-Aboriginal

Canadians hold toward First Nations issues, the authors choose to focus on the positive aspects of the Aboriginal-colonial relationship. They optimistically argue that Canadians must simply and directly embrace all Canadians as treaty people if the country is to positively move forward. The authors identify three keys that all Canadians must accept as treaty peoples: Aboriginal peoples must be accorded status and honor by both state and society, Aboriginal political communities must be empowered within Canadian political systems, and Aboriginal peoples must be put on equal footing with other Canadians through expanded economic opportunity. Complementary texts include Michael Asch's *On Being Here to Stay* and John Ralston Saul's *The Comeback*.

Management Accounting at the Hudson's Bay Company: From Quill Pen to Digitization describes the 1670 to 2005 evolution of management accounting at the longest surviving commercial company in the world. This book was possible for the extraordinary reason that by plan, and the nature of HBC's early business, the company retained virtually all management accounting documents. Through the viewpoint of management accounting, the book also tells the story of Anglo-American evolution of double-entry bookkeeping for managing companies.




A study of 335 years may seem daunting until recognizing that management accounting does not change often, and changes are exciting, dramatic and consequential. Five significant sets of management accounting changes were identified, each made for significant strategic or more precisely for survival reasons. Thus, the focus of this book is on the making and remaking of management accounting to support survival strategy.

A serious lesson is that management accounting can be difficult to change and without insightful managers, existing management accounting is allowed to survive well beyond its usefulness.


Menkis and Troper have produced a definitive history of Canada's role in the 1936 Olympic Games held in Nazi Germany. Their well-researched account covers all aspects of the games with special focus upon those, like Rabbi Maurice Eisendrath, who, after visiting Germany, spoke out passionately against Canadian participation in the Olympics. The book also chronicles the sports figures from Canada who did (and in some cases did not) participate in the games, and the controversies in Berlin, particularly concerning hockey, that were of special interest to Canadians. The book lacks a central thesis, and general readers will prefer David Clay Large's Nazi Games,

the best and most readable overall history of the Nazi Olympics. For the Canadian chapter of the story, however, one cannot do better than this book.

History's people: personalities and the past / Margaret MacMillan. Toronto: House of Anansi Press, 2015. 389 pages. CT 2 Mac

In this erudite analysis of major historical figures, MacMillan spotlights individuals who have either made history or documented it. [...] The first three chapters present those who have "left their mark on history," while the last two showcase history's recorders, who shared a "refreshing freedom from the prejudices and judgments of their own times." MacMillan's more surprising choices are her most interesting. While Hitler and Stalin are obvious examples of political hubris, Woodrow Wilson is an idiosyncratic and more fascinating—choice. Nixon, hardly the most the charismatic of American presidents, is convincingly portrayed as a leader of considerable daring in his outreach



to Mao's China. MacMillan's fascination with history's more curious observers builds the book's strongest chapters. Through describing the lives of people such as Victor Klemperer, a German Jewish academic who survived and documented life in Nazi Germany, or Count Harry Kessler, one of the great record keepers of European life in the late 19th and early 20th centuries, MacMillan deftly and engagingly shows that history is a process of capturing the minutiae of life as much as time's epic strokes.
