



Library Collections in the Community: Ross House Museum





From one of Canada's most decorated Olympians comes a raw but life-affirming story of one woman's struggle with depression. [...]

In 2006, when Clara Hughes stepped onto the Olympic podium in Torino, Italy, she became the first and only athlete ever to win multiple medals in both Summer and Winter Games. Four years later, she was proud to carry the Canadian flag at the head of the


Canadian team as they participated in the opening ceremony of the Vancouver Olympic Winter Games. But there's another story behind her celebrated career as an athlete, behind her signature billboard smile.

While most professional athletes devote their entire lives to training, Clara spent her teenage years using drugs and drinking to escape the stifling home life her alcoholic father had created in Elmwood, Winnipeg. She was headed nowhere fast when, at sixteen, she watched transfixed in her living room as gold medal speed skater Gaétan Boucher effortlessly raced in the 1988 Calgary Olympics. Dreaming of one day competing herself, Clara channeled her anger, frustration and raw ambition into the endurance sports of speed skating and cycling. By 2010, she had become a six-time Olympic medalist.

But after more than a decade in the gruelling world of professional sports that stripped away her confidence and bruised her body, Clara began to realize that her physical extremes, her emotional setbacks, and her partying habits were masking a severe depression. After winning bronze in the last speed skating race of her career, she decided to retire from that sport, determined to repair herself. She has emerged as one of our most committed humanitarians, advocating for a variety of social causes both in Canada and around the world. In 2010, she became national spokesperson for Bell Canada's *Let's Talk* campaign in support of mental health awareness, using her Olympic standing to share the positive message of the power of forgiveness.

Told with honesty and passion, *Open Heart, Open Mind* is Clara's personal journey through physical and mental pain to a life where love and understanding can thrive. This revelatory and inspiring story will touch the hearts of all Canadians.


From The Star:

Over her 36 years as Mississauga's mayor, Hazel McCallion has heard all the nicknames but says her favourite is Hurricane Hazel. She fancies it so much she uses it as the title of her long-awaited memoir, *Hurricane Hazel: A Life With Purpose*. [...]

McCallion's autobiography is just as feisty, plain-spoken and straight-shooting as the woman herself. She explains upfront, "I want people to read about my accomplishments — and my failures — so that they see that women can be leaders or hockey players; that seniors need not be put out to pasture simply because of their age; and that hard work truly does pay off."

Without dwelling on it, *Hurricane Hazel* makes you realize that McCallion's accomplishments are all the more striking because of what she isn't: male, young, bilingual, university educated. She's justly proud of the city she built, regally proud of "my people." But there are hints of wistfulness: "I am not saying Mississauga is too big," she writes, "but I sometimes wonder what could have been."

An engrossing read by a unique leader.

The United States has long sought to exert influence on its northern neighbor. While American interference in Canada has not been as extreme as it has been in other countries, it is still significant. Nowhere is this more evident than during the short presidency of John F. Kennedy as highlighted in this latest offering from Boyko. [...] Boyko concludes that the United States and Canada took different paths after sharing a

common past. Diefenbaker was a nation-builder intent on bolstering Canada's autonomy, which frustrated U.S. policymakers as they needed Canada's cooperation in order to set up detection systems and weapons to protect themselves from the Soviet Union. The author discovers that Kennedy's administration actually assisted Pearson in defeating Diefenbaker in the 1963 election by sending knowledgeable members of Kennedy's own staff to bolster Pearson's campaign. VERDICT: A useful addition to any modern North American history collection, Boyko's well-researched account will appeal to those curious about lesser-known aspects of Kennedy's time in office.



This book

acts as a call for all Canadians to make reconciliation and decolonization a priority, and reminds us that once we know the history, we all have the responsibility - and ability - to make things better.

Danny Wolfe truly lived and died by the sword. In this engrossing biography, author and Globe and Mail reporter, Friesen explains how the horrific legacy of Canada's Indian Residential Schools and the rampant poverty of First Nations reserves coalesced into the life a man who had little other choice than to become an outlaw. Danny was born

in Regina, Sask. in 1976. His alcoholic mother was a traumatized survivor of residential school abuse. Danny and his brother, Richard experienced a broken, violence-ridden home life from their earliest years. In 1988, they founded the Indian Posse street gang in Winnipeg. "In the gang," Friesen writes, "Richard and Danny found an acceptance they hadn't found anywhere else in their lives. School was a disaster, family life the same. With the Indian Posse, they had people who cared about them." Through 24 chronological chapters, Friesen details Danny's criminal life, from theft to murder. His story parallels the broader rise of First Nations gangs in Canada, a reckoning of sorts for generations of government-sanctioned cultural genocide and institutional racism. Friesen is a great writer who tells Danny's story with unbiased detachment. The implications of Canadian social policy as reflected in this outlaw's life should be clear to all readers.
