

#### Review from BC Studies:

This book is a must-read for people interested in Canadian history, gender, and electoral politics in Canada. I cannot say enough about *Stalled: The Representation of Women in Canadian Governments*, which includes chapters written by well-known scholars, features a strong cross-section of expertise in Canadian political science, covers virtually every province and

territory, and contains the different constituent groups within a Canadian context. Each chapter tackles hard questions about progress to date and what is next for particular regions or provinces. The informational boxes at the start of chapters offer a sketch of the history, and sometimes the lack of progress, of women in Canadian politics. This might explain the telling name of the book: *Stalled*. [...]

Well-written and appropriate for lay and academic audiences, *Stalled* is the perfect addition to classes in gender and politics, to upper division courses in comparative politics focused on the status of women and politics, and to Canadian history courses. Chapters convey the differences and similarities between the provinces and territories and offer a great argument for why the Senate should not be abolished. Why? Many gains for women in Canadian politics have been made through Senate appointments. And this only scratches the surface of the book's contents. *Stalled* also contains chapters dedicated to the House of Commons and Senate and to Indigenous women and their status within formal Canadian politics. The metabackdrop of the book suggests that we have made gains, but not enough of them. The various chapters offer glimpses of what is needed, but ultimately we need to understand that candidates, parties, the electoral system, and socialization all are at play with the status of women in Canadian politics. We have lots of work left to do.

#### From the publisher:

It is often remarked that politicians' private lives are becoming a feature of political communication in many advanced industrial democracies. However, there have so far been no genuinely comparative studies

examining the personalized nature of political communication. *Intimate Politics* provides for the first time a systematic comparative analysis of such developments in Australia, France, Germany, Italy, Spain, the UK and the US. Drawing on a wide range of primary and secondary sources, it assesses the extent to which the private lives of politicians have become a feature of political communication in each democracy. The book provides a comprehensive account of the shifting boundaries between the public and private, and whether any developments are universal or more advanced in some democracies than others, and seeks to explain why this might be. Intimate Politics will be of great value for students and scholars of communication and media studies and political science and is required reading for anyone who wants a fuller understanding of the transformation of mediated politics in advanced industrial democracies.



In Aboriginal Rights Claims and the Making and Remaking of History, Arthur Ray examines how claims-oriented research is often fitted to the existing frames of indigenous rights law and claims legislation and, as a

result, has influenced the development of these laws and legislation. [...] Ray also explores the ways in which various procedures and settings for claims adjudication have influenced and changed the use of historical evidence, made space for indigenous voices, stimulated scholarly debates about the cultural and historical experiences of indigenous peoples at the time of initial European contact and afterward, and have provoked reactions from politicians and scholars.

While giving serious consideration to the flaws and strengths of presentist histories, *Aboriginal Rights Claims and the Making and Remaking of History* provides communities with essential information on how history is used and how methods are adapted and changed.

Though they serve in many roles and under many titles, no one doubts that political staffs now wield substantial influence in the making of government policy. *Backrooms and Beyond* draws on interviews with ministers, senior public servants, and political advisers to offer the first

detailed Canadian treatment of how that influence is gained and exercised in the policy making process. [...] The book presents a detailed account of partisan advisers' involvement in policy work and a new theoretical framework for understanding this work and its impact. As Jonathan Craft shows, partisan advisers often engage in policy work with public servants, outside stakeholders, and often in types of policy work that public servants cannot.

Backrooms and Beyond is a rich and rigorous look at an important aspect of contemporary Canadian politics, essential reading for scholars and practitioners, journalists, students of the Westminster system from around the world, and those wanting to understand just how policy is made today.
