

# Spotlight on: Steel and Steam




The Library recently received a donation of *Steel and Steam*, by Pierre Berton, with original serigraphs by R.F.M.

McInnis. This volume was produced to celebrate the centennial of the transcontinental railway in Canada.

Fewer than one hundred copies were produced. The pages are encased in a wooden slipcase, and the handle is made from a cast of a railway spike found at Craigellachie, BC, the location of the "Last Spike" driven to complete the railway in 1885.

Donations like this increase the value of the Library as an information resource for researchers from Manitoba and around the world.

Catalytic governance : leading change in the information age / Pamela Meredith, Steven A. Rosell, Ged R. Davis.

#### From Choice Reviews:

In six chapters, Meredith, Rosell, and Davis discuss the needs of a "rapidly changing world that is interconnected and more complex." The detailed model the authors present tackles problems that have "innumerable causes, are tough to describe, and do not have one right answer." The catalytic governance model contains five steps: governments et al. frame a problem and set boundaries; experts and stakeholders engage and

debate; they explore alternatives and futures; they co-create desired futures; governments et al. ratify and disseminate the material. The authors use a case study of the transformation of Canada's payment system from a paper-based system to a digital payment system that includes a digital identification and authentication regime, implementation of electronic invoicing and payments for business and government, creation of a public-private mobile ecosystem, and upgrades to Canada's clearing and settlement infrastructure. Lessons learned from the Payment Task Force provide a detailed description of catalytic governance.



For many Native communities and groups, their first exposure to resource extraction economic policies and western colonialism, is through mining. Although some indigenous peoples have benefited from

the economic and training opportunities provided by the mining industry, the vast majority have found mining to be disastrous to their way of life. Disrupting settlements and social traditions, these mines leave long lasting ecological and societal scars decades after they have been played out and abandoned. This collection of essays focuses on the impact mining has had on First Nations communities in Northern Canada. The authors draw from oral history, archival research, and current legal cases to show how mining has disrupted these communities geographically, environmentally, economically, socially, and spiritually. The authors use the findings of this research to compare the perspective of government and mining industry policy against that of the local communities affected by the mines.

#### From the publisher:

Why do some Members of Parliament (MPs) take the parliamentary floor and speak more than others? Why do some MPs deviate more than others from the ideological position of their party? This book develops hypotheses on legislative speechmaking and evaluates them by analysing parliamentary debates in seven European democracies: Czech Republic, Estonia, Finland, Germany, Ireland, Norway and Sweden. Assuming that MPs are concerned with policy-making, career advancement, and re-election, the authors discuss various incentives to taking the floor, and elaborate on the role of gender and psychological incentives in speechmaking. They test their expectations on a novel dataset that covers information on the number of speeches held by MPs and on the ideological positions MPs adopted when delivering a speech.
