


Spotlight on: ProQuest databases

The Manitoba Legislative Library is pleased to offer desktop access and in-library use of two major Canadian databases by ProQuest. All employees of the Government of Manitoba and Legislative Assembly have access to the following databases:

- Canadian Business & Current Affairs (CBCA) Database is Canada's most comprehensive and diverse full-text online database that combines content from three focused databases: CBCA Business, CBCA Education, and CBCA Reference & Current Events. CBCA Database provides high-quality indexing for over 1,800 publications and full text for more than 700. Broad coverage from a Canadian perspective spans agriculture, business and economics, education, government and politics, health sciences, history, literature, medical sciences, social sciences, and many more subject areas.
- Canadian Major Dailies provides access to current content and significant back files from more than 20 of Canada's top national and regional newspapers in full-text format, including *The Globe and Mail*. Issues of the *Winnipeg Free Press* are available from 2006 to the present. A full title list is available. With same day access to many publications, Canadian Major Dailies provides users with thorough and timely coverage of national and regional events. All titles are cross-searchable on the ProQuest platform.




Vimy: the battle and the legend / Tim Cook. Toronto: Allen Lane Canada, 2017. 500 pages.

Review from **PW Annex Reviews**:

Cook insightfully examines the 1917 battle of Vimy Ridge and evolving perceptions of it as Canadians prepare to commemorate its 100th anniversary. Four Canadian divisions fought at Vimy, and after four days, the Canadians succeeded where other Allied forces had failed. taking the strategic ridge from the occupying German Sixth Army, albeit at the cost of nearly 3,600 Canadian lives. It was a battle that

shaped the still-forming Canadian identity as Canada evolved from colony to dominion to sovereign nation, and the battle has sometimes been described as "the birth of a nation." Although Cook sees that description as myth, and one that has been used by some politicians to promote their own agendas, he writes that it is one of Canada's most enduring narratives. He analyzes the ways that subsequent generations have commemorated Vimy: some made grand speeches and iconic memorials, but others, disenchanted with war, saw the battle as a terrible waste of human life. Covering a century in fewer than 500 pages, Cook's account is necessarily highly compressed, but he effectively conveys a complex topic in a few wellchosen words, showing how Vimy came to hold a place in the Canadian consciousness that no other battle does.



Review from **Choice Reviews**:

In this case study, Matthews discusses the 1998 repatriation of over 80 Ojibwe ceremonial artifacts from a small museum at the University of Winnipeg to an Anishinaabe group in the US that had no family or community connections to the collection. To make sense of a difficult story, Matthews uses an anthropological, theoretical

lens to review the paradoxical controversy that ensued and the eventual return of some of the artifacts to the museum and the return of the water drum to Naamiwan's family. Many North American museums in the last 30 years have encountered repatriation requests, and this case study reveals something of the essence of such processes. Ordered by anthropological categories and museum processes, disrupted by claims and counterclaims, repatriation is never straightforward, in large part because of contrasting cultural perspectives and the social agency that objects often hold. Matthews is careful to present the multiple community and museum viewpoints embedded in the case of Naamiwan's drum, bridging linguistics, anthropological literature, museology, and storytelling.




Human rights in Canada: a history /

Dominque Clément. Waterloo: University of Toronto Press, 2016. xiv, 230 pages.

Review from **PW Annex Reviews**:

The 1982 Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms has been the basis of controversial court decisions that have legalized same-sex marriage and doctor-assisted suicide. Clement (Canada's Rights Revolution) presents a history of how Canada developed "its own unique rights culture," shaped by the idea that "human rights are a sociological and historical phenomenon as well as a legal fact." The meaning of human rights has changed over time because

societies are dynamic, he explains. Each of the five chapters covers a different aspect of rights-culture formation. Clement also discusses the limits of human rights in specific historical eras, as well as how those limits came to be challenged and expanded. In the 19th century, for example, rights talk centered around notions of civil and political rights (usually for white men only). By the mid-20th century, social movements by women, LGBTQ people, aboriginal peoples, and others helped expand human rights to include notions of personal and sexual identity, leading to the adoption of freedom from discrimination as a core human right . Readers may expect this academic study to be dry, but both its content and style make it a good read . The book will be an indispensable resource for anyone interested in the formation of modern Canada.




The Canadian honours system / Christopher McCreery; foreword by General John de Chastelain. Second edition. Toronto: Dundurn, 2015. 712 pages.
