


New maquette in the Library



Anyone who has formed a dependency on a smartphone, tablet, or 24hour digital connectivity would do well to read i-Minds, Mari K. Swingle's eyeopening, and at times unsettling, book. It is both a palatable, compelling exploration of the impact of digital media on the human brain as well as an impressive piece of research. Using her own clinical observations, Swingle conclusively demonstrates that Internet addiction significantly switches brain function.

The point of Swingle's book, however, is to broaden the scope of her observations to encompass everyday users of "i-tech", [...] to examine those who are affected by "technological integration versus technological interference." The author addresses the topic both biologically (what goes on in our brains) and sociologically, from childhood to adulthood. A nice touch is the addition of sections

in which Swingle supports the text with specific references to scientific research.

While Swingle makes an eloquent case for the fact that i-media is "rewiring our brains," she remains nonjudgmental and scientifically balanced in her perspective. This approach makes i-Minds all the more essential as a contemporary study well worth reading.







The education of Augie Merasty: a residential school memoir / Joseph Auguste Merasty with David Carpenter.

More than 70 years ago,
Merasty was sent to St.
Therese Residential School in
Sturgeon Landing, on the
border of Manitoba and
Saskatchewan. It was one of
the 130 church-run schools
that all aboriginal children
were required to attend as a
part of a Canadian
government policy of forced
assimilation in the 20th
century. Between 1935 and
1944, Merasty was physically
and sexually abused, beaten,

insulted, and exposed to unspeakable conditions by priests and nuns who were supposed to educate him. He carried the scars on his mind and body all his life. Unlike many of his peers who suffered similar or worse abuse silently, Merasty remained courageously determined to publish a book that would expose the injustices he and so many other children endured. In Carpenter, he found a superb writer and editor and a tenacious ally who saw the book through to publication even after Merasty's enthusiasm for the project was dimmed first by alcoholism and later by cancer. This book offers a glimpse into Merasty's life in the residential school, exposing a terrible regime where evil went entirely unchecked. A quick read, it's nevertheless a historically significant one.
