## **Spotlight on: ProQuest databases**


The Manitoba Legislative Library is pleased to offer desktop access and in-library use of two major Canadian databases by ProQuest. All employees of the Government of Manitoba and Legislative Assembly have access to the following databases with the use of their library card barcode:

- Canadian Business & Current Affairs (CBCA) Database is Canada's most comprehensive and diverse full-text online database that combines content from four focused databases: Business, Current Events, Education, and Reference. CBCA provides high-quality indexing for over 1,800 publications and full text for more than 700. Broad coverage from a Canadian perspective spans agriculture, business and economics, education, government and politics, health sciences, history, literature, medical sciences, social sciences, and many more subject areas.
- Canadian Major Dailies provides access to current content and significant back files from more than 20 of Canada's top national and regional newspapers in full-text format, including *The Globe and Mail*. Issues of the *Winnipeg Free Press* are available from 2006 to the present. A full title list is available. With same day access to many publications, Canadian Major Dailies provides users with thorough and timely coverage of national and regional events. All titles are cross-searchable on the ProQuest platform.

#### The mosquito : a human history of our deadliest predator /

A pioneering and groundbreaking work of narrative nonfiction that offers a dramatic new perspective on the history of humankind, showing how through millennia, the mosquito has been the single most powerful force in determining humanity's fate.


Why was gin and tonic the cocktail of choice for British colonists in India and Africa? What does Starbucks have to thank for its global domination? What has protected the lives of popes for millennia? Why did Scotland surrender its sovereignty to England? What was George Washington's secret weapon during the American Revolution?

The answer to all these questions, and many more, is the mosquito.

Spotlighting the challenges involved as Labatt executives adjusted to external shocks the advent of the railway, Prohibition, war, the Great Depression, new forms of competition, and free trade -Bellamy offers a case study of success and failure in business. Through Labatt's lively history from 1847 to 1995, this book explores the wider spirit of Canadian capitalism, the interplay between the state's moral economy and enterprise, and the difficulties of creating popular beer brands in a country that is regionally, linguistically, and culturally diverse. 



Drawing on treaties, international law, the work of other Indigenous scholars, and especially personal experiences, Marie Battiste documents the nature of Eurocentric models of education, and their devastating impacts on Indigenous knowledge. [...] She argues that the preservation of Aboriginal knowledge is an Aboriginal right and a right preserved by the many treaties with First Nations. Current educational policies must undergo substantive reform. Central to this process is the rejection of the racism inherent to colonial systems of education, and the repositioning of Indigenous humanities, sciences, and languages as vital fields of knowledge. Battiste suggests the urgency for this reform lies in the social, technological, and economic challenges facing society today, and the need for a revitalized knowledge system which incorporates both Indigenous and Eurocentric thinking. The new model she

advocates is based on her experiences growing up in a Mi'kmaw community, and the decades she has spent as a teacher, activist, and university scholar.

## Review from **Booklist Reviews**:

Jocular and entertaining in his dispensing of remarkable facts about these little vessels of life-to-be, Hanson shares tales of his Central American field work (snakes and all) studying the stonehard almendo seed, which grows into a long-lived, 150foot, rain forest giant supporting an entire, seething ecosystem. This inspires Hanson to vividly describe the evolutionary "virtual arms race" between seeds and seed-eaters. As he visits with seed experts around the world, Hanson marvels over the amazing energetics of seeds, the evolutionary impact of our ancestors' consumption of seeds, especially cooked grains, and the civilizationshaping "political power of grain." He also chronicles the global impact of coffee and chili peppers and seeds' capacity for dormancy, including one excavated 2000-year-old date palm seed that grew into a 10-foot tree in Israel. From hightech, high-security seed banks bracing for climate change to the story of the gum extracted from guar seeds that is used in everything from ice cream to fracking, this upbeat and mind-expanding celebration of the might of seeds is popular science writing at its finest.
