


The audacity of his enterprise: Louis Riel and the Métis nation that Canada never was, **1840-1875** / M. Max Hamon.

Montreal: McGill-Oueen's University Press, 2019. 414 pages.

From the publisher:

A political leader of the Métis people of the Canadian Prairies, Riel is often portrayed as a rebel. Reconstructing his experiences in the Northwest, Quebec, and the worlds in between. Max Hamon revisits Riel's life through his own eyes, illuminating how he and the Métis were much more

involved in state-making than historians have previously acknowledged. Questioning the drama of resistance, The Audacity of His Enterprise highlights Riel's part in the negotiations, petition claims, and legal battles that led to the formation of the state from the bottom up. Hamon examines Riel's early successes and his participation in the crafting of a new political environment in the Northwest and Canada. Arguing that Riel viewed the Métis as a distinct people, not caught between worlds, the book demonstrates Riel's attempts to integrate multiple perspectives -Indigenous, French-Canadian, American, and British - into a new political environment. Choosing to end the book in 1875, at the pinnacle of Riel's successful career as a political leader, rather than at his death in 1885. Hamon sets out to recover Riel's agency, intentions, and imagination, all of which have until now been displaced by colonial narratives and the shadow of his execution. Revisiting the Red River Resistance on its 150th anniversary, The Audacity of His Enterprise offers a new view of Riel's life and a rethinking of the history of colonialism.



A teen's suspicious death, a shocking police coverup and a mother's search for truth: this landmark investigation into justice

and Canada's Indigenous people is re-issued and updated here for the first time in over a decade.

In 1990, on a brutally cold night, 17-year-old Neil Stonechild disappeared from downtown Saskatoon, last seen in police custody. His frozen body was found three days later in a field outside town. Though his mother pressed for answers, a cursory investigation pinned the blame on the teen himself, dead by alcohol and misadventure. Only in 2000, when two more men were found frozen to death, and a third survived his "starlight tour" at the hands of police, did the truth about Stonechild's fate begin to emerge. Soon one of the country's most prominent Indigenous lawyers was on the case, and an open secret was secret no more.

With exclusive co-operation from the Stonechild family, lawyer Donald Worme, and others, *Starlight Tour* is an engrossing portrait of rogue cops, racism, obstruction of justice and justice denied, not only to a boy and his family but to an entire nation.





Organized around a canoe's building materials (birch bark, wood, metal) and uses (the fur trade, modern recreation), this richly illustrated history will entrance any—and they are many—who have taken a paddle in hand. Written by avid canoeists, it begins with the finely crafted, versatile Native American vessels that so impressed colonizing Europeans with their perfect suitability to navigating the rivers and lakes of North America. [...] Neuzil and Sims inject profiles of contemporary craftsmen who build or restore birch bark and wooden canoes into their historical account as they move on to the canoe's twentieth-century rejuvenation as a popular conveyance, chronicling the mass production of canoes, from business fortunes made to design innovations, such as the adoption of aluminum after WWII. The canoe's latter-day role in environmental awareness and appreciation fills out a

fascinating cultural and technological history that, with its hundreds of color and black-and-white images, including many by renowned artists, is a visual as well as informative feast.

Voters want their votes to be effective, and casting a ballot that will have no influence on an election is undesirable--

therefore, some voters cast a strategic ballot when they decide it is useful. This edited volume includes case studies of strategic voting behavior in Israel, Germany, Japan, Belgium, Spain, Switzerland, Canada, and the UK, and provides a conceptual framework for understanding strategic voting behavior in all types of electoral systems. The classic definition explicitly considers strategic voting in a single race with a single winner, which has at least three candidates. This situation is more common in electoral systems that have single member districts that employ plurality or majoritarian electoral rules and have multiparty systems. Indeed, much of the literature on strategic voting to date has considered systems like those in Canada and the United Kingdom. This book contributes to a more general understanding of strategic voting behavior by taking into account a wide variety of institutional contexts, such as single transferable vote rules, proportional representation, two round and mixed electoral systems.
