ARMISTICE OR NOT, CANADA'S BIG VICTORY LOAN WILL BE NEEDED

Even if the armistice terms of the Allies are accepted by Berlin today or tomorrow, it must be remembered that an armistice is not a peace treaty. It may take months, it may take even a year for the peace conference to be gathered together and to arrive at a treaty which will be signed by all parties. In that interval there must be no relaxation of our effort. Our armistice must remain on the ground prepared for any contingency. Our war effort must be continued in every respect, with the sole and heavy exception that there will be no bloodshed.

And even if it were possible to draw up a peace treaty and have it accepted immediately, it would still be necessary that the Victory Loan be fully subscribed.

Our troops will have to be maintained until they are completely demobilized, a long, tedious and expensive operation.

We shall still have to supply food and supplies to Europe and we shall have to supply troops with the credits with which to purchase these supplies and food.

Ships will have to be constructed to make up the enormous deficit left by the ravages of the submarines.

And there is this further consideration: To the investor the prospect of an immediate peace opens up a new vista. It may be predicted with more or less certainty that near again in the lifetime of the present generation will the government of Canada offer to pay the investor 5 1/2 per cent. on his money. It is only a few years ago that small Canadian cities were able to sell their bonds on a 2 1/2 per cent. basis.

Eighteen new cases of Spanish influenza were reported to Dr. Cowan, Medical Health Officer, yesterday, bringing the total number of cases thus far reported up to 243. Of the cases reported yesterday five were in the city, and 5 in the training school, making a total of 10 in that institution. There is yet no signs of abatement of the spread of Spanish "flu" in Winnipeg, for during yesterday twenty new cases and twenty deaths among civilians were reported to the health authorities. This was the largest number reported in one day since the malady first struck Winnipeg on October 3, and brought the total number of citizens who have been afflicted by the disease up to 2,349. Over two thousand of this number, however, have already been released from quarantine. The twenty deaths yesterday brought the death toll up to 126 or less than 3 per cent. There were reported also two deaths among the military there yesterday.

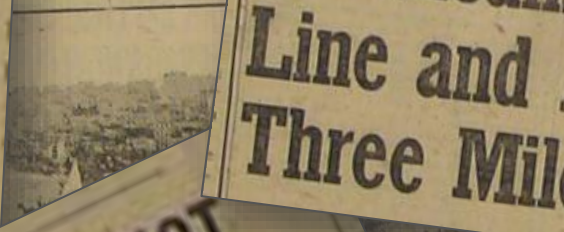
