LONDON, Nov. 11.—(United Press).—Germany today is lawless and kingless. All reports tended to show that in addition to the emperor, all the kings, princes, grand dukes and other royalty of the empire had renounced their "divine right" to rule over a people which already had straggled that right by revolution.
Wilhelm II., the former emperor, his wife and son, the former crown prince, were believed to have reached the coast of Holland at Brnoort, near Vlissingen. It was then said to be Field Marshal Hindenburg and a suite of his staff.

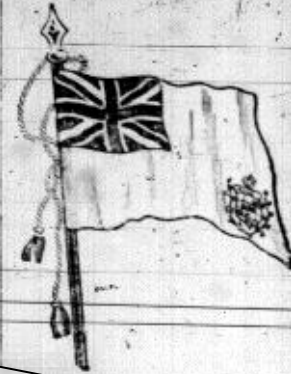

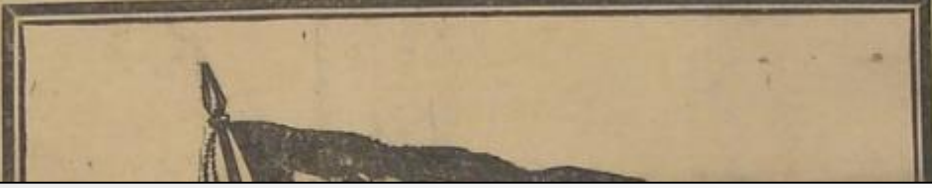

...had ceased. The boys were now safe from shot and shell. The stillness was only broken by the constant ringing of the fire bell and church bells and the joyful laughter of boys and girls preparing for the event of the evening.

The celebration proper commenced about 8 p.m. when the crowds from every house in Town and country around gathered on Main Street to witness and join in the event which will never be forgotten in Delorainé. Under the supervision of Mr. J.S. Jenkin, the whole programme of events had all been carefully arranged. The pile of boxes and rubbish gathered from all parts of town, which had been gradually piling up all day at the Revere corner, had reached enormous proportions and was surmounted by a large German flag beside which was placed an image of the Kaiser in readiness to be ignited at the proper time.

During Sunday night the news came in by Telephone of the signing of the Armistice and at 9.49 Monday morning a message was received from the Free Press which read "War over. Armistice signed midnight by German delegates. Fighting stopped Five o'clock this morning. Kaiser and general staff flee to Holland. Social democrat Ebert now German Chancellor." This was followed by another wire at 11.49 a.m. as follows:—"Officially announced that armistice with Germany was signed this morning. Lloyd George announced cessation of hostilities at 11 o'clock to day, European time, on all fronts in Europe. Mons captured by Canadians."

With the receipt of such news, the importance of which surpassed anything ever received in Canada before, the usual business of the Town was at a standstill. All merchants mutually agreed to close their places of business.

A few patriotic selections from the band opened the proceedings. This was followed by volleys from guns in all quarters of the Town, while a band of girls dressed in costumes of all descriptions, with instruments of all kinds and with torches, paraded the streets, discoursing music? In imitation of a German Band. Fire works of all kinds lit up the public square. At last the appointed time had arrived for the burning of the German flag and the effigy of the Kaiser, symbolically
