The following petitions were presented and read:

Mr. SCHULER – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to request the Provincial Government to consider providing East St. Paul with local ambulance service which would service both East and West St. Paul and to consider improving the way that ambulance service is supplied to all Manitoba's by utilizing technologies such as GPS in conjunction with a Medical Transportation Co-ordination Center (MTCC) which will ensure that patients receive the nearest ambulance in the least amount of time and to consider ensuring that appropriate funding is provided to maintain superior response times and sustainable services. Mr. GOERTZEN – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to request the Premier of Manitoba to consider covering the cost of insulin pumps that are prescribed by an Endocrinologist or Medical Doctor under the Manitoba Health Insurance Plan. (A. Gutoski, D. Harbour, R. Melnyk and others)

Mr. LAMOUREUX – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to request the Provincial Government to consider adopting generally accepted accounting principles in reporting Manitoba's budgetary numbers. (T. Tan, K. Tardiff, J. Hrymak and others)

Mr. ROCAN – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to request the Minister of Intergovernmental Affairs and Trade to consider conducting a review of the circumstances outlined and to consider making a recommendation for redress to the Government of Manitoba. (N. Perrin., A. J. MacIver, W. J. McCartney)
