On motion of Hon. Mr. MACKINTOSH, Bill (No. 11) – The Domestic Violence and Stalking Amendment Act/Loi modifiant la Loi sur la violence familiale et le harcèlement criminel, was read a First Time and had its purposes outlined.

Pursuant to Rule 26(1), Hon. Mr. CALDWELL, Messrs. EWASKO and JHA, Mrs. DRIEDGER and Mr. GAUDREAU made Members' Statements.

The following petitions were presented and read:

Mr. EWASKO – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to urge the Provincial Government to consider collaborating with other levels of government to research the economic benefits and construction costs of a marina in Lac du Bonnet. (B. Hall, J. Mitchell, G. Gresham and others)

Mr. CULLEN – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to request that the Ministers of Family Services, Education and Advanced Learning, and Health consider making funding available to address the current waiting list for ABA Services. (F. Haney, L. Johnson, J. Prazak and others)

Mr. Martin – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to request that the Ministers of Family Services, Education and Advanced Learning, and Health consider making funding available to address the current waiting list for ABA Services. (L. Apperley, J. Hunsberger, M. Anderson and others)

Mr. PIWNIUK – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to request that the Minister of Education and Advanced Learning consider making funding available to eliminate the current waiting list for ABA school age services, maintain the current successful program, and fund true ABA Services for individuals diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder until they reach age 21. (L. Apperley, N. Snidal, J. Rogoza and others)

Mr. SMOOK – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to request that the Minister of Education and Advanced Learning consider making funding available to eliminate the current waiting list for ABA school age services, maintain the current successful program, and fund true ABA Services for individuals diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder until they reach age 21. (F. Haney, L. Johnson, A. Johnson and others)

Mr. WISHART – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to request that the Ministers of Family Services, Education and Advanced Learning, and Health consider making funding available to address the current waiting list for ABA Services. (L. Klein, H. Mills, J. Honke and others)

Mr. SCHULER – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to urge that the Provincial Government improve the safety at the pedestrian corridor at the intersection of PTH# 206 and Cedar Avenue in Oak Bank by considering such steps as highlighting pavement markings to better indicate the location of the shoulders and crosswalk, as well as installing a lighted crosswalk structure. Mr. EICHLER – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to urge the Provincial Government to consider implementing a plan to cover the immediate shortfall in staffing levels and to develop a long term solution to provide timely and quality health care to the residents in the Interlake. (J. Wharton, M. Wharton, R. Bailey and others)

Mr. PEDERSEN – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to urge that the Provincial Government repair and reopen the Provincial Roads 415 and 416 to allow adequate east-west travel in the Interlake. (V. Jeffrey, G. Baldwin, B. McKnight and others)

Mr. Helwer – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to urge the Provincial Government to develop and evolve community based brain injury services that include but are not limited to: case management services known also as service navigation; safe and accessible housing in the community; proctor or coach type assistance for community re-integration programs; improved access to community based rehabilitation services; and improved transportation especially for people living in rural Manitoba and to encompass financial and emotional supports for families and other caregivers in the model that is developed. And Hon. Mr. GERRARD and Mr. EWASKO having questioned the Minister,
And the debate continuing,
And Ms. Allan, Hon. Mr. Gerrard and Messrs. Ewasko and Pettersen having spoken,
And the Question being put. It was agreed to.
The Bill was accordingly read a Second Time and referred to a Committee of this House.
By leave, Hon. Mr. ALLUM moved:
THAT Bill (No. 7) – The Public Schools Amendment Act (Protecting Child Care Space i Schools)/Loi modifiant la Loi sur les écoles publiques (superficie réservée aux garderies dans les écoles) be now read a Second Time and be referred to a Committee of this House.
And a debate arising,
And Hon. Mr. ALLUM having spoken,
And Mr. EWASKO having questioned the Minister,
