The following petitions were presented and read:
Mr. MALOWAY – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to urge the Provincial Government do all that is possible to prevent the Bell takeover of MTS and preserve a more competitive cell phone market so that cellular bills for Manitobans do not increase unnecessarily.
Mr. Chief – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to urge the Provincial Government to commit to raising the minimum wage on a consistent annual basis so that all hardworking Manitobans can provide for their families.
By unanimous consent, it was agreed to have the three sections of the Committee of Supply sit for the consideration of departmental estimates on the morning of June 16, 2016, from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.
By unanimous consent, the sequence for consideration of estimates, as outlined in Sessional Paper No. 15 tabled on June 7, 2016, was further amended in order that the estimates of Indigenous and Municipal Relations be considered in Room 254 for Thursday, June 16, 2016 between 11:00 a.m. and 12:00 p.m., only.
