Pursuant to Rule 27(1), Messrs. JOHNSON, SWAN, TEITSMA and MARTIN and Ms. KLASSEN made Members' Statements.
The following petitions were presented and read:
Mr. MALOWAY – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to urge the Provincial Government do all that is possible to prevent the Bell takeover of MTS and preserve a more competitive cell phone market so that cellular bills for Manitobans do not increase unnecessarily.
Ms. FONTAINE – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to urge the Provincial Government to designate one washroom in the Legislative Building and all other government of Manitoba buildings as a gender neutral washroom.
By unanimous consent, it was agreed to waive the Sessional Order provision requiring a recess between 12:00 p.m. and 1:00 p.m. on Friday, June 24, 2016 in the sections of the Committee of Supply, with the intention that the sections will continue to sit without this recess until the 100 hours of estimate time has expired.
