Pursuant to Rule 27(1), Mrs. MAYER, Messrs. MARCELINO (Tyndall Park), TEITSMA and SWAN and Hon. Mrs. STEFANSON made Members' Statements.

Following Oral Questions, Madam Speaker made the following ruling:

Following Oral Questions on Wednesday, October 25, 2017, the Honourable Member for Minto rose on a point of order regarding comments he attributed to the Honourable Member for Emerson regarding voter suppression in the St. John's constituency. The Honourable Member for Emerson also spoke to the point of order and offered his clarification of what was said. I took the matter under advisement in order to review Hansard at the time of the incident.

In looking at the printed Hansard on page 3133 and from listening to the audio from that period of time, there are no remarks that appear on the record about voter suppression in the St. John's constituency. I would like to note for the House that at two separate times while the Member for St. John's was asking her questions, the questions and answers were interrupted by disorder.

Turning to the substance of the point of order, what we have is a situation where there are two Members that have different perceptions of the same event. When ruling on a comparable point of order on September 25, 1995, Speaker Dacquay quoted Beauchesne citation 494 which states "It has been formally ruled by Speakers that statements by Members respecting themselves and particularly within their own knowledge must be accepted ... on rare occasions this may result in the House having to accept two contradictory accounts of the same incident." Speaker Dacquay went on to rule that since there were two differing perceptions of the same event, there was no point of order. Similar rulings were also made by Speaker Hickes.

I would therefore rule that there is no point of order but I would call on Members to be mindful that comments made from the floor have the ability to create disorder and impede the asking of questions and provisions of answers during Oral Questions.
