# **Community Overview**

### **History**

Baden is one of a group of five in close proximity, with Barrows as the approximate centre and the others are Powell, Red Deer Lake and National Mills.

#### Access

Baden lies about 20 kilometres (km) east of Barrows on Provincial Trunk Highway (PTH) 77 on the northern edge of the Porcupine Provincial Forest, west of Mafeking and east of the Manitoba-Saskatchewan border.

#### Governance

Originally recognized in 1986, Baden is represented by a contact person and defined as a settlement under The Northern Affairs Act.

#### **Economic Overview**

Forest harvesting continues to provide some employment for residents. Some private sawmills operate on a permit basis. Trapping is a primary source of income and shares the registered trapline licences of the Porcupine and Shoal River Registered Trapline Zones.
