Community Overview

History

The main community section is on a point along the north shore of The Narrows which connects Cormorant Lake with Little Cormorant Lake. A single lane timber bridge/causeway connects the balance of the community on the south shore of The Narrows. To the west surrounding Cormorant Lake is Cormorant Provincial Forest.

Access

Cormorant is situated on the east shore of Cormorant Lake in west central Manitoba, 48 kilometres (km) northeast of The Pas. Provincial Road 287 provides access from Provincial Trunk Highway 10 to The Pas. The Hudson Bay Railway passes through the community.

Governance

The community is represented by a mayor and council under The Northern Affairs Act.

Economic Overview

Cormorant's physical location in a relatively flat marshy region, which is part of the Palaeozoic geological zone of Manitoba, is a factor in economic development. The remaining forest areas surrounding Cormorant are part of a designated logging area. Present and potential economic activity is based upon commercial fishing, trapping, forestry and tourism. Potential mineral reserves are also found within 80 km of the community. Wild rice is planted in the shallow areas of nearby lakes. The Pas fish station serves Cormorant fishers. The Cormorant Lodge caters to sport fishers and a number of residents provide guide services to the lodge. Both the Cormorant campground and Cormorant Lake campground provide additional tourist facilities for sport hunting and fishing.
