Dawson Bay was first settled as a fishing site by fishers who commercially fished the bay and Lake Winnipegosis. The community continues to serve as a harbour.

Access

It is located 35 kilometres north of Mafeking and east of Provincial Trunk Highway 10 and on the north western shore of Dawson Bay, which is part of Lake Winnipegosis.

Governance

The community is represented by a mayor and council under The Northern Affairs Act.

Economic Overview

The fish packing plant operates in the summer and winter. There is limited trapping in open areas. Although agriculture has not been developed, there is potential for mixed farming. The soil, which is quite stony, produces good gardens.


