Community Overview

History

Two communities share the name Gods Lake, the community and the adjacent God's Lake First Nation reserve. Information relates to the non-reserve side, unless otherwise noted.

Access

The community is located along the lakeshore of the narrow portion of Gods Lake 224 kilometres (km) by air southeast of Thompson and 547 km by air northeast of Winnipeg.

Governance

The community is represented by a mayor and council under The Northern Affairs Act.

Economic Overview

Gods Lake lies within the Precambrian Shield region, heavily forested with many small lakes. Whitefish in Gods Lake have been downgraded to cutters and not economical to harvest, so there is no commercial fishing. Relatively small amounts of fish are taken from outlying lakes. Trapping occurs in the Gods Lake Registered Trapline Zone. Local lodges are providing residents with seasonal guiding jobs.
