Community Overview

History

Two communities share the name Cross Lake, the reserve and adjacent non-reserve side. Information relates to the non-reserve side, unless otherwise noted.

Access

The community is located on the shores of the Nelson River where the river enters Cross Lake. Provincial Road (PR) 374 connects Cross Lake to PR 373 and onto Provincial Trunk Highway 6. By air, Cross Lake is 120 kilometres (km) south of Thompson and 520 km north of Winnipeg.

Governance

The community was recognized in September 1970 and is represented by a mayor and council under The Northern Affairs Act. The community of Cross Lake was incorporated in 2010.

Economic Overview

Present economic activity includes fishing, trapping and local services. Fishers from Cross Lake, Walker Lake and Pipestone Lake deliver their fish catch to the Wabowden fish station. Trappers have traplines in the Cross Lake Registered Trapline Zone. Small deposits of lithium, copper and titanium in the immediate area are not economically recoverable. Forest resources are substantial and there is some potential for market development. A proposed community centre will create long-term economic growth and enhance community infrastructure.

Fire

Firefighting capability is based on a pumper truck and equipment from the fire hall. Portable forestry equipment is also available for grass and brush fires. The volunteer fire department responds locally and works jointly with the First Nation fire department and responds to motor vehicle accidents. Phone: 204-676-2291. A boat is available for water rescue. A community water truck provides backup water supply.

Water

Water is pumped from Cross Lake to a chemical feed treatment plant where it is filtered, chlorinated and fed to a reservoir. Ninety per cent of the community has piped distribution. The remainder has trucked water delivery.

Wastewater

Wastewater is collected by pump-out truck from homes not on the low-pressure and gravity systems. The wastewater is delivered to a wastewater lift station which empties into a lagoon capable of handling 305,400 litres/day.

Waste Disposal

Solid waste pickup is twice a week and delivered to a site also used by the reserve.

D.R. Hamilton School, operated by Frontier School Division, serves 122 students from Nursery to Grade 9. Phone: 204-676-2278. 
