Norway House

Community Overview

History

Two communities share the name Norway House, the reserve and adjacent nonreserve community. The community is one of the original Hudson's Bay Trading Posts from the fur trading days. Continuing its history as a regional centre, it is also a transportation centre with air carriers flying in all directions. Information relates to the non-reserve side, unless otherwise noted.

Access

The community is located on the east channel of the Nelson River, 29 kilometres (km) north of Lake Winnipeg. Provincial Road 373 serves as an all weather road connecting Norway House to Jenpeg and Provincial Trunk Highway 6. All internal community roads are paved. By air, 456 km north of Winnipeg, 208 km east of The Pas and 190 km south of Thompson.

Governance

The community is represented by a mayor and council under The Northern Affairs Act.

Economic Overview

The terrain, which currently severely limits economic opportunity, is primarily a granite base with little or no soil cover. Large areas are marshy and there are many small creeks, streams and rivers. Several small lakes lie in the nearby area and much of the waterways are dotted with islands. Commercial fishing occurs throughout the year. Fishers deliver their catch to the Playgreen Point and Tait Island fish stations. Other factors in the economy are trapping and local regional services. Trapping occurs in the Norway House Registered Trapline Zone. Wild rice has been seeded in shallow lakes east of Norway House.

There is piped water on Fort Island and West Island. Water is pumped from the Nelson River, filtered and chlorinated and fed into the system. Truck delivery is available for houses not connected to the system.

Wastewater is handled by a combination of wastewater collection lines and a pump-out truck to a lagoon located in the community.

A solid waste site is located on the reserve with transport to the site contracted out.
