Community Overview

History

Red Deer Lake developed as a result of the Red Deer Lake sawmill which closed in 1927. A historic stone vault from the former bank building still remains. Nearby are Barrows, Baden, Powell and National Mills. Approximately 23 per cent of the community boundary, as selected by the Sapotawayek Cree Nation, was transferred to reserve status in November 2018.

Access

Red Deer Lake is eight kilometres north of Barrows which is on Provincial Trunk Highway 77

Governance

Red Deer Lake is recognized as a community under The Northern Affairs Act. There is no council in place.

Economic Overview

Soils in the area have potential for agricultural development and there is limited ranching. Trapping continues to be a major source of employment with shared traplines in the Porcupine and Shoal River Registered Trapline Zones with others nearby. Fishers deliver to Dawson Bay or Red Deer Lake fish stations.


