History

Spence Lake stretches along a 10 kilometre (km) portion of Provincial Road 276 and is primarily an agricultural farming area.

The community is situated between Ste. Rose du Lac 60 km to the south and Meadow Portage immediately to the north.

Economic Overview

The terrain supports mixed farming and woodland operations. Ranching, farming, livestock, commercial fishing and local services are central to this community. Agriculture provides a modest income. Fishing is a secondary activity, done mostly on Lake Manitoba and Lake Winnipegosis. A private fish station is used by the community. Tourism also provides an additional area of activity.
