## REMARKS FROM THE CHAIR

The Municipal Board is established under *The Municipal Board Act* and is required to report annually to the Minister of Intergovernmental Affairs and Trade on the activities of the Board for the previous year.

A summary of the applications made to the Board over the past year is set out on page 3 of this report. As of January 1, 2004, there were 1,503 outstanding applications, appeals and referrals, of which 985 were Winnipeg Assessment Appeals. During the year, 388 new matters were received and 804 matters were dealt with leaving 1,087 outstanding applications, appeals and referrals as of December 31, 2004.

The full complement of the Board, as of December 31, 2004, is 43 Members, including the Chair, Vice Chair and 5 Acting Chairs. The Board holds regular meetings of the Acting Chairs to keep the Acting Chairs and Members informed of the complex issues facing the Board. The Board welcomes Denis Gu nette as Vice Chair. Denis is a full time Vice Chair and he provides the Board with additional capacity to deal with the increased hearing schedule that will result from the general reassessment in 2005.

The Board Website, [www.gov.mb.ca/municipalboard](http://www.gov.mb.ca/municipalboard), established in 2003 to assist applicants in preparing and presenting their appeals before the Board and to increase awareness of the Assessment Appeal process, is up and running.

The Board is faced with a number of challenges in 2005. The primary challenge is to deal effectively with the outstanding Winnipeg Assessment Appeals. While the number of new appeals in this last year of the assessment cycle has decreased, the City is having difficulty scheduling the outstanding Appeals prior to the reassessment. The Board has met with the City Assessor to discuss the large number of outstanding Winnipeg Appeals. The Board continues to work to reduce the backlog of cases and to decrease the turn around time in the production of Board Orders.

The Board has reviewed its procedures and consulted with the City and Provincial Assessors and with Agents who frequently appear before the Board. The Board has initiated a Case Management Strategy to assist the parties in dealing with outstanding issues prior to an appeal proceeding to a hearing. The Board is pleased with its success and has encouraged the City to increase the number of appeals dealt with through the Case Management process.

The Board has witnessed not only an increase in the number of Assessment Appeals but also an increase in complexity and length of the hearings. The Board has 1,047 outstanding Realty Assessment Appeals with a large number being appeals of high value commercial properties. There has been an increase in the number of pre-hearing conferences and the Board has been required, more frequently, to rule on procedural, jurisdictional and admissibility of evidence issues.

The number of hearings and referrals relating to *The Planning Act* and *The Municipal Act* has remained constant and the Board has seen a modest increase in other types of hearings. The Board did not hold any inquires of its own motion in 2004, nor did it issue any licenses, permits or certificates. The fees collected by the Board are summarized on page 32.

In conclusion, I wish to express my thanks and appreciation to the Members of the Board for their co-operation and support. The Members have responded to the increase in the complexity and length of hearings with dedication and commitment to the process. I also would like to thank the former Vice Chair, Lori Lavoie, who has moved from Manitoba. Her commitment and assistance to the Board during her four years as Vice Chair will be missed.

As Chair, I must acknowledge the significant role of the Administration and Staff in ensuring that the Board functions smoothly and efficiently. The Staff's hard work plays an important part in the Board meeting the challenges it faces. I thank them for their contribution to the success of The Municipal Board in carrying out its mandate.

## REMARQUES DU PRÉSIDENT

La Commission municipale, établie en vertu de la *Loi sur la Commission municipale*, doit faire rapport tous les ans au ministre des Affaires intergouvernementales et du Commerce sur ses activités exercées au cours de l'année précédente.

On trouvera, en page 3 du présent rapport, un sommaire des demandes soumises à la Commission au cours de la dernière année. Au 1<sup>er</sup> janvier 2004, 1 503 demandes, appels et renvois étaient en suspens devant la Commission, dont 985 appels interjetés contre l'évaluation fixée par la Ville de Winnipeg. Durant l'année, la Commission a été saisie de 388 nouvelles affaires et a traité 804 demandes, ce qui a laissé en tout, au 31 décembre 2004, 1 087 demandes, appels et renvois en suspens.

Au 31 décembre 2004, la Commission municipale comptait 43 membres, notamment le président, le vice-président et cinq présidents suppléants. La Commission a tenu des réunions ordinaires des présidents suppléants et de ses membres afin de les tenir au courant des questions complexes dont elle doit s'occuper. La Commission accueille M. Denis Guénette au poste de vice-président. M. Guénette, qui est vice-président à temps plein, apporte un renfort qui permettra à la Commission de s'occuper d'un calendrier d'audiences qui sera encore plus chargé à la suite de la réévaluation générale effectuée en 2005.

Le site Web de la Commission, à l'adresse [www.gov.mb.ca/municipalboard](http://www.gov.mb.ca/municipalboard), mis sur pied en 2003 afin de mieux renseigner la population sur le processus d'appel et d'informer les requérants sur la façon de préparer leur appel et de le présenter à la Commission, est en fonctionnement.

La Commission fait face à plusieurs défis en 2005, le principal étant de traiter avec efficacité les appels en suspens liés à l'évaluation foncière fixée par la Ville de Winnipeg. Malgré la diminution du nombre de nouveaux appels interjetés au cours de l'année terminée, la dernière du cycle d'évaluation, la Commission a quelques difficultés à établir les horaires pour entendre les appels liés à l'évaluation fixée par la Ville de Winnipeg. La Commission a rencontré l'évaluateur de la Ville afin de discuter du nombre important d'appels en suspens liés à l'évaluation foncière. La Commission travaille toujours à réduire le nombre de cas en suspens et les délais de délivrance de ses ordonnances.

La Commission a revu ses procédures et a consulté des évaluateurs de la Ville et de la Province, ainsi que des agents qui se présentent souvent devant elle. La Commission a établi une stratégie de gestion des cas pour aider les parties concernées à traiter les questions en suspens avant le processus d'appel menant à une audience. La Commission est heureuse que cette stratégie ait donné de bons résultats, et elle a encouragé la Ville à augmenter le nombre d'appels traités au moyen du processus de gestion de cas.

La Commission a constaté l'augmentation du nombre d'appels liés à l'évaluation, ainsi que

la complexité et la durée croissantes des audiences. Il y a présentement devant la Commission 1 047 appels en suspens liés à l'évaluation foncière, dont un grand nombre ont trait à des appels interjetés contre l'évaluation de propriétés commerciales à valeur élevée. Le nombre de conférences préalables aux audiences a augmenté et la Commission a dû rendre des décisions plus souvent sur des questions de procédure, de compétence et d'admissibilité de preuves.

Le nombre des audiences et des renvois liés à la *Loi sur l'aménagement du territoire* et à la *Loi sur les municipalités* est demeuré inchangé. Le nombre des autres types d'audiences a légèrement augmenté. En 2004, la Commission n'a pas mené d'enquêtes de son propre chef et n'a pas non plus délivré de licences, de permis ou de certificats. On trouvera à la page 32 du présent rapport un sommaire des droits perçus par la Commission.

En terminant, j'aimerais exprimer mes remerciements et ma gratitude à tous les membres de la Commission pour leur collaboration et leur appui. Ils ont répondu à l'augmentation de la complexité et de la durée des audiences avec dévouement et persévérance. J'aimerais également remercier la vice-présidente sortante, M<sup>me</sup> Lori Lavoie, qui a maintenant quitté le Manitoba. Son dévouement envers la Commission et le soutien qu'elle nous a apporté pendant les quatre années où elle a été vice-présidente nous manqueront.
