IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE MANITOBA ENVIRONMENT ACT (C.C.S.M. c. E125) THIS LICENCE IS ISSUED PURSUANT TO SECTION 11(1) TO:

## THE RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF ST. ANDREWS: "the Licencee"

for the construction and maintenance of the Development being riverbank stabilization works on the west bank of the Red River in river lots 108 and 109 in the Parish of St. Andrews, and in accordance with the Proposal filed under The Environment Act and dated August 28, 1997, and subject to the following specifications, limits, terms and conditions:

## **GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

This Section of the Licence contains requirements intended to provide guidance to the Licencee in implementing practices to ensure that the environment is maintained in such a manner as to sustain a high quality of life, including social and economic development, recreation and leisure for present and future Manitobans.

- 1. The Licencee shall ensure that all used oil products and other regulated hazardous wastes generated by the machinery used in the construction and maintenance of the Development are collected and disposed of in accordance with applicable Manitoba Environment and legislation requirements.
- 2. The Licencee shall revegetate soil exposed during the construction of the Development with native or introduced grasses or legumes. Native species shall be used to revegetate areas where native species existed prior to construction.
- 3. The Licencee shall, during construction of the Development and during spring runoff, use sediment control traps. The traps shall be cleaned of silt and debris following construction and following spring runoff. The traps shall be removed when revegetation is completed.
- 4. The Licencee shall ensure that riprap used to stabilize shoreline areas subject to high velocity flows consists of clean fieldstone and/or limestone. Broken concrete shall not be used as riprap material.

## SPECIFICATIONS, LIMITS, TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 5. The Licencee shall notify the Eastern-Interlake Region of Manitoba Environment and the Impact Assessment Archaeologist of the Historic Resources Branch not less than one week prior to beginning construction of the Development. The notification shall include the intended starting date of construction and the name of the contractor responsible for the construction.
- 6. The Licencee shall ensure that no construction activities which could result in sedimentation in the Red River occur between April 1 and June 15 of any year.
- 7. The Licencee shall ensure that all construction debris resulting from the Development is deposited at a Waste Disposal Ground operating under the authority of a permit pursuant to *Manitoba Regulation 150/91* respecting *Waste Disposal Grounds*.
- 8. The Licencee shall ensure that fuel and lubricant storage areas established for the construction and maintenance of the Development are located a minimum distance of 100 metres from any waterbody, and shall comply with the requirements of *Manitoba Regulation 97/88R* respecting *Storage and Handling of Gasoline and Associated Products*. Refueling operations shall not be undertaken within 100 metres of any waterbody.

## **REVIEW AND REVOCATION**

A. If, in the opinion of the Director, the Licencee has exceeded or is exceeding or has or is failing to meet the

specifications, limits, terms, or conditions set out in this Licence, the Director may, temporarily or permanently, revoke this Licence.

- B. If construction of the development has not commenced within three years of the date of this Licence, the Licence is revoked.
- C. If, in the opinion of the Director, new evidence warrants a change in the specifications, limits, terms or conditions of this Licence, the Director may require the filing of a new proposal pursuant to Section 11 of The Environment Act.
