THIS LICENCE IS ISSUED TO:

## THE PROVINCE OF MANITOBA REPRESENTED BY THE MINISTER OF HIGHWAYS AND TRANSPORTATION: the "Licencee"

for the construction and operation of the Development being the upgrading of Provincial Trunk Highway #16 in the vicinity of Newdale beginning at the west junction of PR #250 and extending to the east junction of PR #250 in the Rural Municipality of Harrison subject to the following specifications, limits, terms and conditions:

## SPECIFICATIONS, LIMITS, TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. The Licencee shall construct the Development in accordance with the Environment Act Proposal Proposed Upgrading of Provincial Trunk Highway #16 (vicinity of Newdale in the R.M. of Harrison), dated November 8, 1994.
- 2. The Licencee shall, prior to construction, provide a copy of this Licence to all contractors and sub-contractors involved in the Development.
- 3. The Licencee shall, prior to construction of the Development, notify the Department of Natural Resources Regional Wildlife staff regarding the preconstruction meeting scheduled to be held in accordance with Other Proposed Environmental Management Practices identified under Section 7.7 of the Environment Act Proposal Proposed Upgrading of Provincial Trunk Highway #16 (vicinity of Newdale in the R.M. of Harrison), dated November 8, 1994.
- 4. The Licencee shall, prior to construction, consult and reach an agreement with the Department of Natural Resources Regional Wildlife staff, regarding a site specific wetland mitigation plan. The plan shall:
  - a) recommend replacement or mitigation for the loss of wetland areas affected by the Development; and
  - b) provide for an post development evaluation of the wetland replacement or mitigation implemented pursuant to Clause 4 (a).
- 5. The Licencee shall, prior to construction, consult and reach an agreement with the Department of Natural Resources Regional Wildlife staff regarding the location of areas to be avoided during the nesting period of waterfowl and upland birds where suitable habitat exists.

- 6. The Licencee shall, during construction, adhere to Manitoba Environment's *Temporary Batch Plant Siting Procedures*.
- 7. The Licencee shall, during construction, ensure that fuel storage and fueling areas established for the construction of the Development are located a minimum distance of 100 metres away from the high water line of any watercourse and wetland within the Development area and shall comply with the requirements of Manitoba Regulation 97/88R respecting Storage and Handling of Gasoline and Associated Products.
- 8. The Licencee shall, during the full term of the construction of the Development, cleanup and deposit all debris from the construction site at a Waste Disposal Ground operating under the authority of a permit pursuant to the Manitoba Waste Disposal Ground Regulation, MR 150/91.
- 9. The Licencee shall, following construction, vegetate disturbed areas with native grasses.

## REVOCATION

If in the opinion of the Director the Licencee has exceeded or is exceeding the limits, or has not complied or is not complying with the specifications, terms and conditions set out herein, the Director may revoke, temporarily or permanently, this Licence.
