In accordance with the Manitoba Environment Act (C.C.S.M. c. E125)

THIS LICENCE IS ISSUED TO:

THE PROVINCE OF MANITOBA REPRESENTED BY THE MINISTER OF HIGHWAYS AND TRANSPORTATION: the "Licencee"

for the construction of the Development being the upgrading of the Black River Access Road beginning at Provincial Road #304 and extending from Provincial Road #304 to the east boundary of the Black River Indian Reserve for a distance of 3.7 km subject to the following specifications, limits, terms and conditions:

SPECIFICATIONS, LIMITS, TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. The Licencee shall construct the Development in accordance with the Environment Act Proposal Proposed Upgrading of Black River Access Road (from PR 304 to the Black River Indian Reserve No. 9 E.D. of Rupertsland), dated September 13, 1995.
- 2. The Licencee shall, during the design stage and prior to construction, review any plans to replace the stream crossings with the Department of Natural Resources Fisheries Branch and Eastern Region and the Department of Fisheries and Oceans.
- 3. The Licencee shall, during construction of any stream crossings related to the Development, adhere to the Manitoba Department of Natural Resources Guidelines titled Recommended Fish Protection Procedures for Stream Crossings in Manitoba.
- 4. The Licencee shall, during the design stages and prior to construction, review plans for the use of borrow areas and gravel sources with the Manitoba Department of Natural Resources Eastern Region.
- 5. The Licencee shall, two weeks prior to start of any construction, notify the Manitoba Environment Director of the Eastern-Interlake Region of the anticipated construction schedule.
- 6. The Licencee shall, from May 1 to July 1 of each year during construction, cease any construction activities that may impact upon breeding wildlife.

cease all construction activities that may impact upon stream channels related to the Development and which may affect fish mobility or fish habitat.

- 8. The Licencee shall, during construction, ensure that all fuel storage areas established for the construction of the Development are located a minimum distance of 100 meters away from all lakes and streams, and shall comply with the requirements of Manitoba Regulation 97/88R respecting Storage and Handling of Gasoline and Associated Products Regulation.
- 9. The Licencee shall, during the full term of the construction of the Development, cleanup and deposit all debris from the construction site at a Waste Disposal Ground operating under the authority of a permit issued pursuant to *Manitoba Regulation 150/91R* respecting *Waste Disposal Grounds*.

REVOCATION

If in the opinion of the Director the Licencee has exceeded or is exceeding the limits, or has not or is not complying with the specifications, terms and conditions set out herein, the Director may revoke temporarily or permanently, this Licence.
