AN ORDER OF THE CLEAN ENVIRONMENT COMMISSION

UNDER THE CLEAN ENVIRONMENT ACT

RE: THE CLEAN ENVIRONMENT COMMISSION and THE PARAMOUNT BIO-CHEMICALS LTD., Applicant,

WHEREAS

pursuant to the provisions of The Clean Environment Act, Paramount Bio-Chemicals Ltd. filed an application with the Department of Mines, Resources and Environmental Management in connection with the operation of an animal feed processing plant located at or near 128-134 James Avenue in the City of Winnipeg;

AND MEERIAS

in the absence of limits being prescribed by a Regulation under the said Act, the said application was referred to The Clean Environment Commission for the prescribing of limits:

AND WHEREAS

no representation was made to the Commission by any person who is, or is likely to be, affected by an Order of the Commission prescribing limits in connection with the said operation;

AND WHEREAS

the Commission considered the application on the 14th day of February, 1977;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT

- 1. The Applicant shall ensure that particulate emissions from the various processes of the said operation do not exceed 0.57 grams per standard cubic meter calculated at 25° Celsius and 760 mm of mercury at the point of emission.
- The Applicant shall ensure that particulate matter from any source of the said operation does not become airborne to such an extent as to create a haze in excess of 5 percent opacity beyond the property line of the said operation.

- 3. The Applicant shall ensure that all open piles of process material from any source on any structure or in any yard area of the Company is removed and disposed of in a suitable manner to prevent the wind entrainment of particulate matter.
- 4. The Applicant shall ensure that a high standard of equipment maintenance and good housekeeping practices are carried out at all times to meet the requirements of Clauses 1, 2 and 3 of this Order.
