Re: Feedstock Trial at Enviroclean Landfill Solutions Ltd. – Licence 2999

Environmental Approvals Branch is in receipt of your electronic correspondence of February 27, 2017, and supporting correspondence from Maple Leaf Foods Inc., submitted February 24, 2017. The correspondence requests authorization to begin an 8 week trial to compost up to 10 tonnes of DAF sludge, 4 tonnes of protein fraction, 5 tonnes of manure soaked straw and some paper towel waste in addition to other feedstock currently eligible for composting under Clause 29 of Licence 2999. Feedstock is from Maple Leaf Foods Inc. in Brandon to be composted at the Enviroclean Landfill Solutions Ltd. facility in Morden, MB.

Upon review of the submission, we have determined that the potential environmental effects of the trial are insignificant and therefore I have decided pursuant to Section 14(2) of *The Environment Act* to approve the proposed 8 week trial pursuant to the following conditions:

- 1. Upon completion of the 8 week trial, a report, due within 6 weeks of the end of the trial, is to be submitted to me summarizing the results, volumes of feedstock utilized, volumes of compost created, analytical results of the compost and what the compost was used for or if it was sold;
- 2. The Licencee shall not store any feedstock material from Maple Leaf Foods Inc. outdoors;
- 3. The Licencee shall only accept feedstock in sealed containers, and shall process the feedstock within 12 hours of receiving it;
- 4. The Licencee shall notify the assigned Environment Officer no less than 5 days prior to receiving the first load of feedstock from Maple Leaf Foods Inc.;
- 5. This approval is in effect for 8 weeks from the date of receiving the first load of feedstock from Maple Leaf Foods Inc.; and
- 6. The Licencee shall notify the assigned Environment Officer within 10 days if either party (Enviroclean or Maple Leaf Foods) cancels this trial within the 8 week timeframe requested.

In accordance with Section 14(2) of *The Environment Act*, a Notice of Alteration is required to be submitted to my attention to alter the feedstock identified in Licence 2999 to include the items above permanently, or for any other requested changes to licence conditions as issued.
