Park Patrol Officer (seasonal position)

DESCRIPTION

Park Patrol Officers work under the direction of a senior Resource Officer or Park Patrol Captain. Park Patrol Officers are responsible for promoting compliance with the rules and regulations of campgrounds and other public areas in Provincial Parks for the purpose of ensuring the safety, security and enjoyment of the public. They investigate violations and complaints, gather evidence, prepare court documents, issue written warnings and offence notices, and attend court as necessary. As a key front line staff member they will provide visitor services and may perform maintenance tasks. Officer may carry out other resource related duties such as angler checks, problem wildlife control and back country patrols. We will provide comprehensive training prior to hire and develop your potential to pursue your chosen career in Conservation Law Enforcement. The employment period is usually from mid May to September long weekend.

QUALIFICATION & SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

- Completion of year one of a recognized resource management diploma or degree program or a graduate from a recognized law enforcement diploma program or year two of an undergraduate degree in the studies of Law or Environmental studies or an equivalent combination of education, training and experience
- Good communication skills both oral and written
- Ability to work under stress, make decisions and problem solve
- Must possess a valid full Manitoba class 4 drivers licence(an equivalent out of province licence is acceptable)
- Must have valid standard first aid, level C CPR and Canadian Firearms Safety Certificates
- Must possess a clear criminal records check (must not have been convicted of a criminal offence for which a pardon has not been granted)
- Must not be on the Manitoba Child abuse registry
- Must be physically able to perform duties assigned (PARE test is an asset)
