<p>1. Boilermaker Trade Regulation <i>Staff: Vanessa May</i></p>	<p>Branch staff:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Re-affirmed that the Apprenticeship and Certification Board (Board) approved the PAC's recommendation to reduce the term of apprenticeship from four levels to three levels.</li> <li>• Informed the committee that the Board did not support the recommendation to reduce the hours from 1600 hours to 1200 hours, as the members did not feel that the apprentice would receive adequate training.</li> <li>• Stated that the Canadian Council of Directors of Apprenticeship (CCDA) has approved three levels (1800 hours per level), in accordance with the CCDA harmonization initiative.</li> <li>• Recommended that the PAC revisit the hours to align its program with the approved CCDA harmonization project.</li> </ul> <p>The PAC members confirmed and supported the proposed hours of three levels/1800 hours per level, for a total of 5400 hours as it provided a clear direction for apprentices in the trade. The committee also determined that a transition clause will be drafted in the trade regulation to address current apprentices in the program and new apprentices entering into the program. Apprentices who are currently in the program (four levels, 1600 hours per level) may be given credit for some hours.</p>	Closed.
