Financial Supports for Apprentices

The Manitoba government subsidizes a major portion of apprentice tuition fees for inschool training. This provides apprentices the opportunity to pay much lower tuition fees than students pursuing other post-secondary options, such as university.

In some cases, employers may also choose to assist their apprentices with tuition fees and books, making apprenticeship an even more cost-effective education option.

In addition, a variety of grants and financial incentives are available to assist apprentices in covering the costs of tuition, textbooks and supplies. See the following chart for details.

Financial Supports for Employers

Employers play a vital role in the apprenticeship and certification system, by providing on-the-job training for apprentices and helping to build a skilled provincial workforce.

For employers, hiring an apprentice offers the opportunity to attract and retain highly skilled employees. Employers also have access to a range of financial incentives and grants when they are engaged with apprenticeship training. See the following chart for details.
