The Canadian Economy Shows Resilience

Canadian GDP rose by a strong 0.6 per cent in January, representing a solid rebound from December. The gains appear to have continued in February, according to Statistics Canada, which forecast growth of 0.4 per cent.

The outlook for the first quarter, therefore, looks promising. The Bank of Canada has updated its forecast and now expects growth of 2.8 percent for the period.

MARKET ACCESS SECRETARIATE FOOD INDUSTRY UPDATES

Indonesia Acknowledges Two Canadian Halal Certification Bodies

Indonesia halal regulations enter into force on October 17, 2024. Indonesia's regulations will require that all food and beverages be certified/labelled as either "halal" or labelled as "non-halal".

Products from nature such as plants and raw commodities (e.g. wheat, soybean), and products that are not processed/altered, that have not been modified with additives or other substances, and that have no risk of including haram substances (including risk of cross-contamination) are exempt from halal labelling.

Qatar – New Food Regulations

Certificate of Conformity is a new requirement that Qatar is now enforcing. This certificate is now required for products that fall under one of the 3 following categories: foods that are genetically modified (GM) or contain GM ingredients, organic food products, and foods treated with radiation.

We strongly encourage Canadian exporters to obtain a Certificate of Conformity prior to shipping products affected by Qatar's new regulation to avoid any issues when shipments reach Qatar. The Certificate of Conformity must accompany shipments of the types of food products covered by this regulation and the preshipment inspection must happen in Canada.

Share Your Thoughts on the Safe Food for Canadians Act

The Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA) seeks feedback on the Safe Food for Canadians Act (SFCA). *SFCA* came into force on January 15, 2019. The *Act* requires ministers to review its provisions and operations every five years. CFIA is therefore carrying out a review.

They are asking consumer associations; food industry and industry associations; manufacturers/processors; distributors/retailers; importers; trading partners; academia and experts; other government departments and agencies, including provincial, territorial and municipal; and the general public to review key questions in the consultation document and submit their feedback. Consultation ends May 27, 2024.
