Farm Cash Receipts 2024



February 28, 2025

Farm cash receipts are the top line revenue in agriculture for the calendar year. For the full review of financial results including farm expenses and total net farm income, visit manitoba.ca/agriculture/markets-and-statistics/financial-statistics in late May when that data will be released.

Manitoba realized 2024 farm cash receipts of \$9.79 billion, down \$455 million or 4.4 per cent under 2023. Canola, wheat, hogs, cattle, soybeans, potatoes, dairy, poultry and eggs, corn for grain, and oats make up the top 10 sectors for cash receipts for 2024. Crops contributed 60.6 per cent of total receipts for 2024, livestock generated 35.2 per cent and direct payments totaled 4.2 per cent of receipts.

The top five sectors by farm cash receipts were canola, wheat, hogs, cattle and calves, and soybeans. Canola produced \$2.00 billion in receipts, 20.4 per cent of Manitoba's total. Wheat brought in \$1.70 billion, representing 17.3 per cent of total receipts. Hogs contributed a record \$1.58 billion, providing 16.1 per cent of Manitoba's total receipts. Cattle and calves likewise produced another record of \$984 million in receipts, accounting for 10 per cent of total receipts. Soybeans realized \$525 million, or 5.4 per cent of total farm cash receipts, but were down \$310 million compared to 2023.

Total crop receipts were 10.2 per cent lower in 2024 compared to 2023, with canola, wheat and soybeans down a combined \$836 million. Potatoes continue to be a rising star, however, with a fifth consecutive new record of \$516 million, up 23.3 per cent from 2023.

Manitoba's livestock sectors produced record high receipts of \$3.45 billion in 2024, up five per cent from \$3.28 billion in 2023. The hog sector drove the increase in receipts generating \$1.58 billion, representing 46 per cent of all livestock receipts. Receipts were 7.7 per cent higher than in 2023. Cattle and calf receipts rose by 3.3 per cent to a record \$984 million in 2024.

Receipts from supply-managed commodities were \$754 million in 2024, up 2.8 per cent compared to 2023. Supply-managed commodities made up 22 per cent of total livestock cash receipts. Milk sales contributed \$377 million (up 5.6 per cent), poultry contributed \$229 million (down 0.6 per cent) and eggs contributed \$177 million (up 2.8 per cent). Sheep and lamb receipts, at \$16.1 million, were 13.9 per cent higher in 2024, compared to 2023.


Honey receipts were 15.3 per cent lower at \$41.6 million for 2024. Manitoba is Canada's second biggest honey producer, after Alberta, with 17 per cent of all Canadian honey receipts.

For 2024, program payments totalled \$408 million, up 14.3 per cent from 2023. Crop insurance payments were \$215 million, private hail insurance was \$48 million, Agrilnvest was \$36 million, and AgriStability payments came in at \$85 million. Direct payments comprised 4.2 per cent of total farm cash receipts for 2024.

In 2024, Canadian farm cash receipts dropped 2.1 per cent to \$97.3 billion, from the record high of \$99.4 billion in 2023. Manitoba's share of Canadian farm cash receipts held at 10.1 per cent. British Columbia, New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island and Newfoundland and Labrador saw receipts increase in 2024, while all other provinces experienced declines.
