It is our pleasure to welcome you to the 2021 Manitoba Protein Summit. This is our second Manitoba Protein Summit, a gathering of key agricultural, food processing and academic stakeholders engaged in accelerating our province's economic position through plant, animal and alternative protein development.

The plant and animal protein industry continues its impressive growth with many opportunities for new products, new markets and the advancement of new technologies. **Manitoba** is at the forefront in the development of the protein industry and is <u>emerging as a protein powerhouse</u>, with significant new investments being made and processing capacities coming online in both plant and animal protein processing. The Consortium also engaged with the University of Manitoba to develop a <u>Protein Research Strategy</u> that will align and leverage synergies in our research and innovation community.

Some of the exciting features of the 2021 Manitoba Protein Summit include:

- Alison Cairns from the United Nations, who will share her views on how the increased demand for food by a growing global population can be met in a sustainable manner.
- Jo-Ann McArthur from Nourish Food Marketing, who will provide us with key market and consumer insights for North America's protein industry.
- Abby Lyall from Big Idea Ventures, who will discuss how to attract investment in protein and innovative technologies, as well as trending product categories.
- Wageningen University and Research (Netherlands), The Good Food Institute (Washington), EY Parthenon, University of Manitoba, Maple Leaf Foods, Roquette, HyLife Viresco, Cargill Proteins, and others will participate in panel discussions on various topics, including ways to drive innovation through collaborative networks, the post COVID-19 protein industry, and sustainability trends.

Through the 2021 Manitoba Protein Summit, we hope to increase our collective knowledge about opportunities in protein, determine means to create new value and increase markets for Manitoba protein, as well as energize each other to do our part in further advancing the sector and adding to our success.
