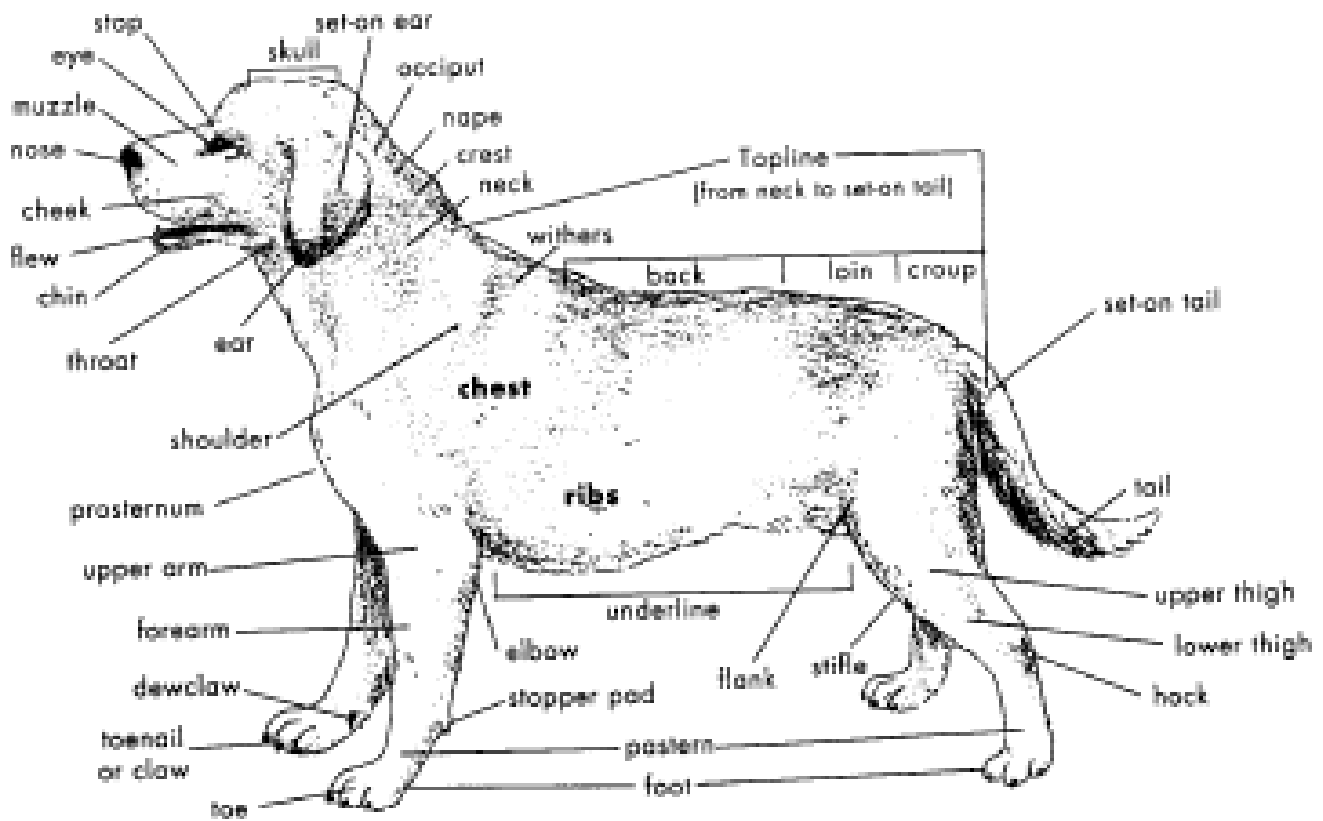

	Perfect Score
Head	24
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Bite – should be able to tell the difference between level, scissors, overshot and undershot	
Body, feet and legs	24
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Neck• Shoulder angulation• Prosternum depth of chest• Width of chest between front legs• Topline• Group• Rear angulation (stifle and hock)• Check male for testicles	
Movement	22
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Well knuckled feet• Should recognize paddling• Weaving and crossing over• Moving too wide or too close• Cowhocks, crabbing and side winding.	
General Properties	30
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Expression - overall appearance of dog's head with special consideration given to the look in his eye (friendly, wary, etc.)
