# SKIN CARE TECHNICIAN

## A Complete Pass

The candidate must meet or exceed industry standards in each of the five (5) Sections. Only sections that do **not** meet industry standards need to be repeated. Sections where the client has previously met industry standards do **not** require retesting.

### Practical Examination Marking Scheme

Five sections are to be completed at the initial practical examination. Each of the five sections outlines a list of criteria that the Examiner will be looking for in the performance of the task.

The marking scheme will be a 'checkmark' system and will follow the standards as set out in the chart below.

The number of checkmarks (✓) required to pass each section (D-F) is a minimum of **7 out of 10** tasks equal to **70%**. This is the competency and level of performance required to meet or exceed industry standards.

Candidate's performance of tasks	Examiner's mark	Description
Meets or exceeds industry standard	✓	Candidate shows competency in the task or high level of skill and proficiency in the task. Performance meets or is above industry standard in preparation, technique, and skill.
Does not meet industry standard	X	The candidate shows little or no competence in the task. Performance is below the industry standard in preparation, technique, and skill.

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### Supervisory Exemption Marking Scheme

Supervisory exemption is achieved when a candidate demonstrates **90%** proficiency in **ALL** sections of the Practical Examination.

The marking scheme will follow the same check mark system and standards set out in the Practical Examination Marking Scheme.

The number of checkmarks (✓) required to pass each section (D-F) is a minimum of **9 out of 10** tasks equal to **90%**. This is the competency and level of performance required to achieve supervisory exemption status.

Supervisory exemption status can only be obtained on the **initial attempt** of the practical examination. Re-writes in any section **DO NOT** qualify for supervisory exemption status.
