# Mandate:

In accordance with The Provincial Court Act amended by The Courts Modernization Act in 2019 establishes the ACJJP. In accordance with these amendments, the Minister my only appoint a judicial Justice of the Peace from a list of qualified candidates recommended for appointment by an ACJJP.

# Authority:

The Courts Modernization Act The Provincial Courts Act

# **Responsibilities:**

When the minister advises the Chief Judge that the appointment of a judicial justice of the peace is required, the Appointment Committee for Judicial Justices of the Peace must meet to consider candidates for the appointment in question.

# Committee to meet to review application

The committee must meet at least annually to review applications that have been received and evaluate candidates.

# Membership:

The committee consists of the following:

(a) The Chief Judge, or a judge designated by the Chief Judge, who is the chair of the committee;

(b) Two persons appointed by the minister.

3 Year Term (2 Term Max)
