How to wear a mask Do's and Dont's

Don't: leave your nose exposed



Don't: Wear you your mask on the tip of your nose



Don't: Leave your chin exposed



Don't: push your mask under your chin



Don't: wear you mask very loose with large gaps on the sides



Do: wear your mask high on the bridge of your nose to under your chin, and try to make it snug to avoid gaps



Tips

- Wash/sanitize hands before and after you touch your mask
- Remove your mask with the ear loops/ties- do not pull down
- Do not touch the front of your mask
- When you remove your mask, place it on a clean surface

Red Rashes

 Most red rashes are IRRITATION from mask friction and not a true allergy

- What to do:
 - Do not over wash the skin- this can make it worse
 - Wash with water and gentle cleanser/unscented soap
 - Avoid irritating face creams/ washes
 - Gentle moisturizer, ceramide containing
 - Wash non-work medical masks regularly, cotton
 - If persists talk to your HCP

Mask acne: Maskne



New onset acne or worsening of pre-existing acne

What Do You Do?

- Treat as "regular" acne
- After remove mask, wash face with gentle cleanser
- Apply oil free moisturizer if dry
- Avoid "Make- up" under masks!!!
 - "break up with make up"
- Over the counter benzoyl peroxide washes or creams may help
- Wash non-work medical masks regularly, cotton
- Acne prescription medication may be needed- talk to your
 HCP

Nose and Face Trauma



What Do You Do?

- It is difficult
- Hydrocolloid or band-aid to affected area
- Ok for a surgical mask
- Not acceptable for "N95 respirator"
- Barrier moisturizer- contains "dimethicone"

Rash or Pain Behind Ears

- Tight elastic behind ears- discomfort
 - Option: string- tie mask, clip that connects the ear loops behind the head instead of behind the ears



What do we do in the Winnipeg cold weather?

- No "science" behind it
- Bundle up:
 Mask + scarf on top of mask= winter fun!!!

A winter scarf is not a substitute for a mask
