Oil Bulletin Adoption of 2015 Oil Code

The Canadian Standards Association B139 Series-15 - Installation Code to Oil burning Equipment (Oil Code) will come into effect in Manitob or October 1, **2018.** This code has been adopted without any amendments.

This new 2015 edition of the Oil Code represents a major update from the 2009 edition of the code. The updates reflect the different egare nents for residential installations, large installations, special installations and separate requirements for stationary engines.

Consequently, the updated code is organized intermultiple palls at follows:

- Part 1.0 Large Installations. This art is intended for industrial, institutional, and larger commercial buildings and can be used for any size of installation.
- This part contains new requirements that are intended to address the needs of these more complex system.
- Part 1.1 Stationary Engines. This part includes special requirements applicable to stational sengines serving generators and fire pumps, and other equipment such as large compressions.
- Part 12 Special Installations. This part groups the existing requirements for used on burning appliances, central oil distribution facilities, construction beaters, and vehicle heaters into a single section.
- Part 70 Residential Installations. This part focuses on the requirements for smaller installations typically used in single and two-family dwellings, as well in small column val buildings. Most of its content is recognizable from the previous dition but has been updated and simplified to suit these installations

Adoptin of this de will bring Manitoba in line with our New West Partnership courrerparts in Western Canada, and other Canadian jurisdictions. Everyore responsible for conducting oil related work is encouraged to familiarize thems gives with the 2015 edition of this installation code, which can be purchased online rom the CSA Group.
