Manitoba Health Card

- Basic health care and medical services are free with Manitoba health care coverage https://www.gov.mb.ca/health/mhsip/

- Services that are covered for <u>free</u> include:
 - Of Going to the hospital, seeing a health care provider (doctor, nurse, etc), X-rays and laboratory services (blood tests) ordered by a doctor or nurse practitioner, most surgery and treatment provided by medical specialists, routine immunizations, eye exams every 2 years for those who are <19 years old and who are 65 years of age and older, and up to 7 chiropractor appointments per calendar year.</p>
- Services that are **not** included for free:
 - Emergency ambulance services, dental work, eye exams (people between 19-64 years),
 prescription medications, doctor's notes or Driver Fitness Exams, private counseling,
 physiotherapy, massage therapy, osteopath, travel immunizations, cosmetic procedures.

Immigration Medical Exams (IME) Appointments

- Immigration Medical Exams (IME) are currently being provided at no cost under Manitoba Health.
- The Immigration medical exam includes a physical exam, chest x-ray and bloodwork.
 - o Children under the age of 12 do **not** need bloodwork or chest x-rays.

- If needed, ask for an interpreter to communicate in your preferred language.
- Important to identify if you have a newborn baby so your request will be prioritized

Prenatal Care

- During pregnancy, your medical care is free. You may choose to see a doctor or a midwife on a regular basis.

Walk-In Connected Care

- You do **not** need an appointment. Call before you go as they may be full for the day and may not be able to see you. Bring your health card or health number with you.

Walk in Clinics

- You do <u>not</u> need an appointment to see a health care provider at a walk-in clinic, but availability depends on how busy the clinic is and is on a first come, first served basis.
- Doctors & nurses work at the clinic. They provide health care, prescribe medication or refer you to a specialist (cardiologist, nephrologist, etc.) Referrals are free. Bring your health card or health number with you.

Hospital or Emergency Department Visits

- Attending Emergency Departments or Urgent Care Centre and required hospital admissions (including for childbirth) are covered under Manitoba Health for free. Bring your health card or health number with you.

Eye Care

- Eye exams are free and covered by Manitoba Health every 2 years for people younger than 19 years of age & older than 65 years of age.
- People 19-64 years of age will need to pay for an eye exam by an eye doctor (optometrist).
 Prices will vary depending on the optometrist. Some provide discounted pricing for UA war evacuees.
- Eye specialists (ophthalmologists) are covered under Manitoba Health for those of any age who
 may have an eye condition. A referral from a health care provider is required to see an
 ophthalmologist.
- The cost of corrective lenses (glasses or contact lenses) is not covered by Manitoba Health.

Prescription Drugs

- Manitoba Pharmacare is available to cover some prescription drugs.

Language Access

- You can ask for a trained interpreter to be present during your appointments with health care providers.
- Interpreter services are free of charge.
 - Services are free for patients in publicly funded health services such as hospitals, community health services and Cancer Care Manitoba.
 - Services are free for patients seeing their family doctor in Winnipeg.
 - Interpreter services are also available for seeking Manitoba government and health services in other Manitoba health regions
 - Invoice for interpreter services is sent to the service provider



Ambulance

- Emergency ambulance services are **not** covered under Manitoba Health for free.
- Ambulance service will be provided to anyone who needs it, but you will receive a bill after receiving services and will have to pay later.
 - o you can work with Manitoba Health to pay after the service has been provided.
- If you need an ambulance, please call 9-1-1

Vaccinations or Immunizations
