


Manitoba Health Card Registration for Ukraine Arrivals

Welcome to Manitoba!

Ukrainians Nationals traveling to Manitoba under the federal <u>Canada-Ukraine Authorization for Emergency Travel (CUAET)</u> are eligible for health care coverage as of the date they arrive in Manitoba. Manitoba Health will issue a health insurance card (or registration certificate) to you which covers each member of your family.

The health card (see picture below) confirms your eligibility to access health services, <u>provided you continue to reside in Manitoba</u>. Carry your certificate with you at all times, and present it whenever you or your dependants require health services.

Manitoba Health issues a card (or registration certificate) to all Manitoba residents, which includes a 9-digit lifetime identification number for each family member.



How do I apply for coverage?

Please complete a Manitoba Health registration form and provide copies of your identification documents (i.e. passports), your visa (either a visitor or a work visa is acceptable), and a Manitoba address where you will be residing. A temporary address such as a hotel is acceptable.

Where can I register for a Manitoba health card?

There are three places to register for a health card:

1) Reception Centre

You can attend in-person at the Best Western Plus, 1715 Wellington Avenue in Winnipeg. Call 2-1-1 as hours of operation may vary. Your application will be processed and your card returned to the reception centre within 48 hours.



2) Registration and Client Services Manitoba Health

You may register in-person at our main counter located on the 1st floor, 300 Carlton Street. One person per household visiting the office is preferred. Your application will be processed and your card mailed to you at your residence.

3) Submit documents by email, fax or mail
